SERMON STUDY GUIDE

Questions for family/small group discussions

Isaiah 7:14; 60:1-3; 9:1-6 - God With Us in the Darkness

- 1. When you consider texts such as Genesis 1:2, Revelation 22:5, and Ephesians 6:12, what do we learn about the world in which we live and where we are going? How much does this cosmic clash between darkness and light work on you and how does it do so?
- 2. When you read Isaiah 7:14 and Matthew 1:22-33, what does God's grand and stunning invasion into the darkness through a baby say about God and how he works? What does it say about how you should work to bring light into the darkness—with your marriage, kids, or at school or your workplace?

We see that God provides the way to hope, joy and peace in the midst of the despair, sadness and chaos through two essential steps:

a. What do Isaiah 8:21 and Jeremiah 17:9 say about the danger of sin and what it does to us? How have you seen this kind of blindness in your heart and life? What does this blindness say about how desperate we are without an intervention?

b. In what part of your life are you saying, "Don't look at me, God."? Or what are areas of your heart and life where you would hate for the light to be turned on? Ask a friend, family member, or spouse to help you see and name some sin or darkness in your heart and life.

c. What does Psalm 32 say about what happens or should happen when you keep sin under the covers of darkness? What does Psalm 32 say about the results of confessing to God? Ask God to reveal sin to you and take time to confess, repent, and give thanks for the joy of forgiveness.

2. Arise and _____!

- a. What does Isaiah 60:1-2 reveal about our condition apart from God and what is our only hope? How is that hope ultimately fulfilled?
- b. What do Isaiah 6:1-3 and Matthew 5:14-16 reveal about what is to be our response to receiving "...the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ" (2 Cor. 4:4-6)?
- c. How is the world different because you have been born and born again? How is your marriage, home, workplace, community, school, and church different because you have shined with the light and presence of Jesus? What step could you take this week to shine with the presence and beauty of Jesus in one of these places?
