SERMON STUDY GUIDE

Questions for family/small group discussions

John 21:14-19 - Do You Love Me?

a. What do you learn about our mission when you read Luke 5:1-11, Col. 1:13, and Mt. 5:14-16? What does it mean to be an alternate city or community within the city? What are some ways that we should look like the city and not look like the city? How will our lives demonstrate that Jesus is our Lord?

b. How does a diversity of difficult people working together put Jesus on display and become attractive?

a. We saw from John 15:13-15 that a true friend always lets you in and never lets you down. How do you manage what you allow others to see? What keeps you from being transparent or vulnerable?

b. When you reflect on your friend relationships, do you enter into and maintain those relationships for your sake or theirs?

c. How might you have settled into being fed rather than feeding? Since we are to feed and love even the difficult people whom Jesus sends to us, what can you do to see and be open to those whom Jesus might send your way?

d. What does Mark 14:29 reveal about Peter's heart and why he would struggle to love Jesus and others? How does thinking you are better than others show up in your words, actions, and relationships? How does Jesus gently restore Peter in John 21? Do you see how Jesus could be restoring you in the same way?

3. God's _____ provision.

a. Reveling in the perfect love and friendship of Jesus enables us to love and feed rather than having to be fed or hunt for love from others. What are some ways that you would describe the friendship that Jesus offers to you?

b. What has happened to Peter or what has he learned and absorbed so that he is now truly ready to follow Jesus? What do you need to learn and be reminded about yourself and Jesus so that you will follow him in the same way—to become a friend like he is a friend to you? Who can you take a step toward this week to be a friend for their sake and how will you do that?
