SERMON STUDY GUIDE

Questions for family/small group discussions

John 3:1-15 - Nic at Nite

Five questions about the new birth:

1. is it for?

What do we learn when we consider that Jesus teaches Nicodemus, who seems to have his life/morality together, that he needs to be born again, and yet in John 4, he makes no mention of it to the woman, whose life is a sinful, chaotic mess? What might this say about your need for new birth?

2. does it come from?

When you read John 3:5, Mt. 19:28, and Titus 3:4-5, where are we headed and how do we get there? Where does the power for all of this come from and what does this power mean for you today?

3. is it?

What do John 3:5 and Ezek. 36:27 say about where this new life comes from? When you consider that this new life involves a new identity, where have you most often looked to for your identity? What has been the impact as you have searched for your identity outside of Jesus and his love for you?

Can you remember a time or times when God's love became more real to you than any of the other things that you have looked to for love? What have you seen differently since your new birth?

4. _____ do you get it?

How might you see yourself trying to contribute or save self through your efforts rather than through the gift of God's grace? How has Jesus gone through the "labor" that provides for your new birth? Take time to repent of the things/efforts that you have trusted in to gain God's acceptance and claim what Jesus has done for you!

When you see in John 16:21 that Jesus compares himself to a woman giving birth, what do you learn about what he has done and what he has gained for you? Why does Jesus go through this pain for you?

5. _____ do you know?

When you consider the transformation of Nicodemus' heart and life, what are the characteristics that most stand out? Do you see these changes in your own heart and life? Take time to confess any pride and timidity and ask God for a spirit of courage, boldness, and humility.

When you consider the tombstone of John Berridge, have you made the transition from living "proudly on faith and works for salvation" into fleeing "to Jesus alone for refuge"? If not, let this be the day!
