

SUMMER 2025 YOUTH GROUP BIBLE STUDY

9-10am on Wednesdays — June 18, 25; July 9, 16, 30; August 6, 13, 20. For whoever is interested, we will be meeting for a relaxed, hour-long Bible study focused on growing in the skills needed to read and understand God's Word. Each week we'll look at a different passage and ask questions like: What does it say? How does it reveal Jesus? How does it connect to the rest of Scripture? What does it mean for me? Students will spend time prayerfully reading and reflecting on the passage before coming together to discuss what we've learned. This isn't a deep dive into one book—it's about building a toolkit to help students confidently approach any passage of Scripture on their own and apply it to life.

the first NT book written.

TO WHOM: Jewish believers in Jesus scattered

throughout the world

To encourage believers to live out their WHY:

> faith in day-to-day life, not merely as a ritual or custom, but as deliberate acts of faith and worship. James writes with many references to the sermon on the mount and the book of Proverbs.
