**David Douglass**, member of PRCC for over forty years was always trying to elevate PRCC in the public eye. He thought **everyone** should know the goodness and joy to be found at his church. His humor and joy didn't fade throughout his life, but when he was teaching the middle school youth, his childlike Spirit really shone! As a testimony to his dedication to young people, his memorial funds were placed in a special reserve fund for youth to award scholarships when needed and make sure **youth ministry** would be a priority for years and years to come!



**Ed Numrych**, beloved member for many years, was always "almost fantastic" with a warm smile and gentle laugh. He was so proud of how welcoming PRCC was, and he would regularly ask for copies of the sermons to share with his family. In order to remember Ed's passion for making others **safe and welcome**, his family dedicated memorial funds from his estate to launching the **Air Conditioning** fund. These funds, combined with a gift from Reggie Pantazi and Stanley Malinowski made it possible for the Board to approve installing air conditioning in 2025.



Cathy Stewart prayed for everyone. Her faith emanated from her smile and her heart in ways that left a profound impact. Memorial gifts in Cathy's honor have gone towards purchasing a stole for Pastor Mollie's ordination and have combined with gifts from other Saints' memorial funds to commission a new baptismal font, which will be used in the sacrament of baptism for years to come as we celebrate God's unconditional prevenient grace for all people - the young and the not so young! Cathy's effusive love carries on as we live into her vision for God's church that embraces all!
