Park Ridge Community Church (PRCC) is partnering with Vitalant to host a **"Virtual" Blood Drive NOW – March 1st.** A virtual blood drive means that you can schedule your blood donation at a time and location that works for your busy schedule.

Every day in the U.S., patients in hospitals, surgical centers and emergency treatment facilities need approximately:

#### \* 29,000 units of red blood cells

\* 5,000 units of platelets

\* 6,500 units of plasma

The need for blood is at its highest level as the health crisis continues to impact patients. Donating blood is one of the easiest ways to help others. The actual donation time is about ten minutes but it will take about an hour from start to finish with screening questions and recovery time after donating.
