There's a national blood shortage due to the pandemic.

All healthy donors are urged to donate!

Park Ridge Community Church (PRCC) is partnering with Vitalant to host a "Virtual" Blood Drive NOW – March 1st.

A virtual blood drive means that you can schedule your blood donation at a time and location that works for your busy schedule.

Sign up to donate below. Be sure to copy the full link so we can track the number of donors who participate with PRCC. Once you sign up via the link, you'll receive an emailed invitation to book your appointment at a time and location convenient to you.

Every day in the U.S., patients in hospitals, surgical centers and emergency treatment facilities need approximately:

- * 29,000 units of red blood cells
 - * 5,000 units of platelets
 - * 6,500 units of plasma

The need for blood is at its highest level as the health crisis continues to impact patients. Donating blood is one of the easiest ways to help others. The actual donation time is about ten minutes but it will take about an hour from start to finish with screening questions and recovery time after donating.

Donors must be at least 18 years of age or 16/17 year old's are required to have a signed parent consent (forms in requirements link below). Additional eligibility and general questions about the process – please click on links below:
