# **Blood Facts & Statistics**

• Every 2 seconds someone in the U.S. needs blood.

• One in 7 people entering a hospital will need blood..

• A single blood donation can help more than one patient and could help as many as three.

• Vitalant needs 5,300 donations every day to support patient needs in the 900 hospitals we serve.

• Vitalant needs over 216,000 new donors annually to safeguard blood needs for patients.

• The majority of the population is estimated to be eligible to donate blood but only 3% do.

• First-time donors get an initial screening of their blood type when they make their first blood donation at a Vitalant blood drive or donation center (not applicable in Nevada due to state restrictions).

• All blood types are critically needed, especially Type O.

• Type O is often needed in an emergency as well as for routine lifesaving surgeries, cancer treatment and more.

• Blood donation is an essential activity.

• All Vitalant blood drives and donation centers follow strict protocols to ensure the safety of donors, volunteers, patients and staff. Review current COVID safety measures at vitalant.org/COVID-FAQs.

 Blood donations decline as much as 20% during the winter months due to cold and flu and weather impacts.
