"Though Advent (literally arrival") has been observed for centuries as a time to contemplate Christ's birth, most people today acknowledge it only with a blank look. For the vast majority of us, December flies by in a flurry of

activities, and what is called "the holiday season" turns out to be the most stressful time of the year. It is also a time of contrasting emotions. We are eager, yet frazzled; sentimental, yet indifferent. One minute we glow at the thought of getting together with our family and friends; the next we feel utterly lonely. Our hope is mingled with dread, our anticipation with despair. We sense the deeper meanings of the season but grasp at them in vain; and in the end, all the bustle leaves us frustrated and drained." (the introduction of *Watch for the Light: Readings for Advent and Christmas*)

This year, in particular, we begin Advent already exhausted. Over these next few weeks, we will consider the question "How Does a Weary World Rejoice?". It is our hope that together, in spite of our weariness, indeed perhaps because of it, we will discover the joy and hope in the truth that God has chosen to take on flesh and dwell among us. God did not wait for perfect conditions, but enters our reality bringing peace that defies explanation, hope that pulls us into a realm beyond our reality, joy that is rooted in God's promises, and love that strengthens us for the journey. I pray that this Advent we might give ourselves some grace and space for God-with-us to turn our cares into prayers and our sorrows into rejoicing. It is that transformation that gives us the ability to rejoice even when we are bone weary. We will have events, programs and worship that will invite us to transcend our reality into a faithful space of God's love.

I am longing for these four weeks of preparation with you as we wait for the incarnation to appear! God is born in our hearts and in our lives again! I wish each of you a blessed Advent season and very Merry Christmas!!

# MEET THE MUSIC STAFF The Weber Family

Hello, I'm Angie Weber, my husband is Andrew Weber and our children are Lily and John Weber. We have been at PRCC since 2000. I'm one of the soprano soloists/section leaders and Andrew is one of the bass soloists/section leaders. We also do all the Sunday school music which includes the Christmas pageant and Vacation Bible School. Sundays you'll see us at the 8:30 service with our guitar and mandolin singing folk/bluegrass. This summer John started playing with us on bass, and also started doing a lot of reading/filling in as worship leader. Then at the 10 o'clock service we're singing with the choir, and then with the Sunday school.

We both received Bachelors of Music Degrees from the University of Wisconsin – Green Bay (yes, that's why we're Packers fans) and Masters of Arts – Music/Vocal Pedagogy Degrees from Northeastern Illinois University. Andrew has been teaching music at the Melrose Park school district for 27 years. I taught at Northeastern Illinois University for 16 years, and was the Music Education Coordinator for the Elmhurst Park District for 6 years. Now I have a private studio at our home in Villa Park where I teach voice and piano to students in the area.

We've both done pretty much every style of music from Opera/Operetta and Oratorio, to folk, pop, jazz, bluegrass. My favorite role would probably be Mabel from "Pirates of Penzance" or Lucy from Menotti's "The Telephone." Andrew would tell you he always hated acting, but he did a pretty mean Sergeant of Police in "Pirates of Penzance." We both loved to sing Faure's requiem, but my favorite oratorio is probably "The Seven Last Words of Christ." This past Good Friday it was especially meaningful for me. After a year of struggling vocally and going through Vocal therapy, rest and patience, I was finally able to sing it again.

My favorite hymn is, without a doubt, "O Sacred Head Now Wounded." I love it because of the harmony part that was written by Bach. But I also have an affinity for "In the Garden," and I'm pretty sure that's Andrew's favorite, because it is one of the first hymns that Andrew and I started singing together when we started playing guitar and mandolin. We always do it at the first outside service every spring.

I don't know if I can recall one favorite music memory from my time at PRCC. There have been so many. I feel like this is where Andrew and I grew up, in a way. When we started singing here we were both graduate students at NEIU. Here is where we became serious musicians, and were able to experiment with different styles and types of music. Being here allowed us to grow. There is nothing more terrifying then writing music and putting it out into the world. Here at PRCC I felt safe enough to start writing my own music, and perform it. I love singing the songs I wrote for John and Lily's baptisms, on Mother's Day and some of the other songs I wrote. It is rare to feel safe as a musician to really put yourself out there.

Andrew and I feel very blessed that we have been able to share our music with the Park Ridge Community Church for the last 26 years, and hope to continue for many more.
