As I sit down to write this, I am actively working to create a plan to support those whose SNAP benefits are ending, working with an interfaith group on interrupting the harm of the ICE raids, detention, and deportation machine, worrying about how the climate crisis

is making disastrous hurricanes and wildfires more frequent, and considering all our Saints, whose legacies continue to be a blessing.

Read, process, pray, rant, repeat. That has become my new routine. I try and listen to enough news that I am not ignorant of the violence and evil perpetrated, but not so much that it consumes me. I'm not sure I've achieved the right balance. One of the things that brought me joy recently was walking hand in hand with sweet Sophia as we raised money and awareness to combat hunger through the CROP Walk. It feels good to physically DO something. It was also a healing balm for my soul to experience this beautiful child's delight and wonder.

Joy, wonder, and delight are a form of resistance that foster resilience.

When Nehemiah was helping lead the reconstruction after the Babylonian exile, he writes "The Joy of the Lord is my Strength." The "weeping prophet" Jeremiah is reminded of the goodness of God: "I know the plans I have for you- for good and not for harm, a future that is filled with hope" - that is God's dream!

As we near the end of Stewardship and dream of this next year(s) of ministry, those words give me hope. Because no matter what is happening out there in the world, I know in the depths of my soul that God IS with us and has prepared us for such

For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, ...to give you a

FUTURE WITH HOPE. a time as this (see Esther). God has used the people of Park Ridge Community Church effecting transformation in the world for almost 200 years...and God is using us now.

On Nov. 16, we join hands and hearts once again to recommit to sharing in this work together, giving what we can to be the church that we can, responding with faithfulness, determination, and unwavering hope in what God IS doing. I am so honored to be on this

In all things, give Thanks

"Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things." Philippians 4:8

Our recent sermon series is titled "Sacred Worth: Imbued by the Creator." As Pastor Carol said in the first sermon of this series, **IMBUED** is a great word! To be *imbued* is to be filled up with or become soaked or saturated with something. We are imbued - filled up with and saturated by the Divine with sacred worth. That is a truth that can sometimes be lost because we also live in a time that can imbue us with worldly challenges, ideas and fears. Walking with a Stephen Minister helps us find a way to be intentional about what we fill ourselves with.

You may know the story of the Child who said to the Elder there were two hungry, competing wolves fighting inside them. The fire wolf fights with anger, greed and fear and wants to destroy everything. The snow wolf offers love, peace and gratitude and wants to plant seeds and nurture them. The Child asked the Elder, "how do I know which wolf will win?" The answer is the one you feed or fill up with your time and energy will ultimately become stronger and win.

As people of God who have experienced the world in many ways, we can understand these competing realities. The Divine offers unconditional love, peace beyond understanding, purely motivated acceptance and so much more. This earthly place has examples of these Godly gifts, as well as illness, broken relationships, violence, greed, inequities, selfishness and many elements that are the opposite of God's ways. When we pour our attention and resources into the fire wolf, it can be difficult to remember that we have Sacred Worth. When our snow wolf gets filled with our attention and resources, it's easier to remember and then share our Sacred Worth in this broken world. There are points in our lives when we need support and need help to intentionally feed and fill up our snow wolf. That is where Stephen Ministry comes in.

A Stephen Minister helps show you that you are imbued by the Creator with sacred worth. Your Stephen Minister is there to listen to you and pray for you in a confidential setting, so you are supported in facing the world's challenges. The simple act of walking with a Stephen Minister is a way to feed your snow wolf – to know your Sacred Worth. Every Stephen Minister who has a care receiver feels blessed by the relationship so having a Stephen Minister is also a way to feed and fill up their snow wolf. By deciding to walk with a Stephen Minister, you are caring for yourself, encouraging your Stephen Minister and blessing the team of Stephen Ministers. Have you considered becoming a Stephen Minister yourself? The Stephen Ministry team is looking to begin a training soon. Thursday, Nov. 13th at 7 pm Park Ridge Presbyterian Church


The need for peace is as great as it's ever been before.


