The Pastor's Note

One of the greatest gifts of being part of PRCC is the way we walk through life together. In seasons of joy, we celebrate side by side—at baptisms, weddings, confirmations, and mission trip send-offs. In times of sorrow, we hold one another close, sharing prayers, meals, and quiet presence. Across generations and life stages, we are a family of faith, caring for one another as a living reminder that no one travels this journey alone.

When we say "Here you belong. Here you are home" we mean it! I witness it in the way Sandy greets middle schoolers from the community as they walk in the door every Wacky Wednesday. I see it in how the mentors sit and discover with the Confirmands. I see it in the Senior Contact team members visiting those who cannot physically attend worship. I see it in every meal prepared for by the Outreach Team. This kind of love is





possible because of a truth deeper than circumstance: our value comes from God. Each of us is created in the image of the Creator, imbued with sacred worth that cannot be earned or lost. Yet in a world that measures success by achievement or appearance, we can easily overlook or devalue the holy and divine spark within ourselves and others. The noise of conflict and uncertainty can make us forget that, at our core, all are God's beloved.

Our stewardship theme, **Sacred Worth: Imbued by the Creator**, calls us back to this foundation. Stewardship is more than budgets or pledges; it is the daily practice of honoring God's gifts—our time, talents, resources, and relationships—by nurturing the sacred worth in everyone we meet. It is the quiet phone call to someone who is grieving, the joyful welcome to a newcomer, the faithful prayer for a struggling friend.

Participation in the CROP Walk becomes another way we embody this call. As children walk beside adults and neighbors share the path, we proclaim that every person—near or far, hungry or full—matters to God. Each step is an act of love, raising support for those who need food, clean water, and the dignity of knowing they are not forgotten.

As we enter this stewardship season, I invite you to begin praying about how you might share your financial gifts to support the life and ministries of PRCC. **Your generosity allows us to continue shining God's love and light in a world that longs for hope**—sustaining worship, nurturing and caring for one another, and reaching beyond our walls in Christ's name.

In a world that feels heavy with turmoil, our shared walk—and our shared life—each foot we put in front of the other—testifies to something stronger than fear: the Creator's love alive in us. May we give with grateful hearts, trusting that God will use every gift to bring more light, more love, and more life to the world. We can find hope in that!

3. Updating Our Resources to Facilitate Ministry


- Teaching faithful stewardship

"Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light," Matthew 11: 28-30

Blessed are the caregivers with hearts wide open, ears to listen and hands to hold; for you are angels here on earth.

You are beautiful, selfless people in our midst. You know who you are! You are truly the hands and feet of Jesus to all of God's beloveds - parents, spouses, children, grandchildren, students, neighbors, friends and strangers. Caregiving is not a 9 to 5 job... but a true labor of love... and you do it without hesitation, again and again. Your care and love is freely given, because you want to make the load lighter for those around you.

But who is caring for you? Can you hear the flight attendant sharing before every plane takes off... "if an oxygen mask becomes necessary, be sure to put your own mask on first, before helping those around you." This is not selfish, but necessary. How can you help others without being prepared yourself? Being a caregiver for our dear ones can become overwhelming and our focus on self-care of our body, mind, and spirit often gets pushed to the back burner. We can find ourselves running on empty and our own cup so depleted, that we cannot possibly care for another. A beautiful hallmark of a Stephen Ministry caring relationship is checking in with our care receivers to ensure they are pursuing self-care, so now it is my turn to check in on all of you.

Pursuing self-care is not negotiable and has to be a part of your plan. You have to care for yourself first, so you will have a strong body, mind, and spirit to care for others. To engage in self-care is empowering and will keep you focused and your cup replenished, so that you can support those who depend on you. What self-care strategies will you add to your calendar? It doesn't have to be extravagant, just intentional. A walk in the park, slipping away with a cup of tea and a good book, taking a friend up on an offer for a few hours of respite from your dear one, getting good nutrition, an uninterrupted night of rest - whatever you need most and make it happen. I will be praying for your care giving ministry and that you will make a commitment to find space for peace and restoration in your journey.

I am humbled to be a part of this amazing ministry team and the greatest gift of all is to be able to pray with and for all of you. The Stephen Ministry Team is here to intentionally walk with you as you navigate all the seasons of life. If you think you could benefit from the care of a Stephen Minister, please reach out to Sarah McCarty, Pastor Carol or Pastor Mollie or any of our Stephen Leaders to help you get connected.

Finally, mark your calendars! The Stephen Ministry team is excited to announce the start of our **Faithful First Sundays** during this ministry season. Each month we'll explore a different approach to prayer, building confidence around an aspect of faith that some find daunting. Sandra (Sandy) Bowen: Director, Bells on High

I joined PRCC in 1970 and started ringing bells in 1980 when the first two octaves of bells were purchased by the Nautilus Group. Jerry Butera was the director and eventually asked me to direct a second group. I was interested in handbells because my aunt directed a group in Florida. At one point I was directing the Community Church Chimers (4th – 6th), the Good Vibrations (7th -8th) and The Vibes (high school).

I have my B.S. and M.ED degree from U of I and I was on the faculty of Maine East for many years and I still proctor A.P. test in May. I regret never taking any music classes in college but I did take a Directing class at music camp when I was in 7th or 8th grade.

I really enjoy ringing the "old-time" hymns which my family sang as I grew up. One of my favorites is "Ivory Palaces" which is rarely found in hymnals. My sister and I play if often as a duet with me on the piano while she plays the organ. When I visit my home town we almost always play for worship.

One of my favorite bell pieces in "Peace" which we ring at the end of the Service of Remembrance each year. We now do it with choir members singing and it is such a meaningful way to end this special service.

There are many musical highlights from my years at PRCC. One special memory of mine is the choir singing the "Seven Last Words of Christ" with Jerry Butera on the organ as the music duplicates the drama of the "earth did quake and the rocks were rent and all the graves were opened wide." Another highlight every year is the arrangement of the "Lord's Prayer" played by the Wehman Band. The highlight for the bells is the choir and bells combining to ring/sing "Now the Green Blade Rises."

PRCC is responsible for involving me in, what has become, a passion for handbells. In addition to ringing at PRCC, I ring in the "Random Ringers" which is a community group providing programs at libraries, retirement homes, etc.



Creation Care News

Perhaps you've heard that we have started to compost food waste at PRCC and you're wondering what that actually involves.

We are subscribing to a commercial composting service, Collective Resource Compost Cooperative. You can learn more about them and get a complete list of compostable items <u>HERE!</u>

Here's how to COMPOST AT PRCC:

- In the kitchens you will see compost bins lined with compostable bags for food waste, coffee grounds and other approved compostable items.
- Once the bags are full, they should be taken outside to the designated 5 gallon orange bucket located in the trash area.
- Replace a new liner bag in the kitchen counter compost bin.
- Every Monday morning the 5 gallon bucket will be picked up and replaced with a new, clean, empty one.


