## Question

1. Who was the bully in this story?
2. Who was being bullied?
3. Who stood up to the bully?
4. Who stood with David (hint: you can't see Him, but He is always with us and He was with David.)
5. Can we stand together for what is right?

Activity:

Supplies: 5 smooth stones and sharpie

Directions: Take 1 of the stones and write your name on it. Place it in front of you. Now, I want you to think of the names of people who will stand with you through the good times and bad. Write the names of four of those people on your remaining stones, and place those stones around the stone that has your name on it. (Hint: don't forget that God has promised to be with you always.) You are not alone. No matter what challenges life brings, you are known and loved. Take these stones with you. Place them near your bedside or out in a garden. Sometimes, you your family member or friend may need to be the center stone surrounded by love and prayer of others, put that stone in the center.

God stood with David all those years ago and He stands with us now. Let's pray.
