Proposed Rules

- Captain's Choice Format
- Each player hits from his or her designated tees.
- Players 65 or older play from designated Senior tees.
- Captain will choose best shot for the group, all players will hit the next shot from that spot.
- Balls may be placed within one club length of the ball that is chosen to be played, no closer to the hole, except when on the green.
- Balls must remain in same type lie as shot chosen, i.e.: Fairway/Fairway, Rough/ Rough, Sand/Sand, etc.
- There will be four (4) designated par 3's for closest to the pin prizes. Ball must be on the green to qualify.
- There will be two (2) designated Long Drive Holes (one for men and one for women). Ball must be in the fairway to qualify.
- Mulligans may not be used to qualify for closest to the pin or long drive prizes.




LEE ANDREWS

Lee Andrews was born on December 26, 1935, in High Point, NC to Herbert Lee Andrews, Sr. and Beulah Bouldin Andrews. He was a graduate of Trinity High School and Guilford College and also earned degrees from UNC Greensboro and Appalachian State. On June 29, 1963, he married Doris Wall. Lee was a birthright Quaker and life-long member of Archdale Friends Meeting.

Lee taught in Chatham County and Thomasville City Schools and then from 1965 to 1984 Lee served as a teacher, Dean of Students and Principal of High Point Central High School. From 1984 to 1991 Lee worked at the High Point City Schools Central Office where he served as High Point City Schools Athletic Director and Personnel Director. Following retirement, he served as the Interim Head of School for High Point Friends School in 2006.

Lee passed away on Sunday, October 9, 2022, at Randolph Hospice House in Asheboro, NC and is survived by his wife Doris Andrews; his daughter, Lisa Jones (Walter) of Kinston, NC; son, Herb Andrews (Shandel) of Archdale, NC; his grandchildren, Andrew Jones, John Andrews and Hollis Andrews and his sister, Nancy Myers of Savannah, Georgia. Also surviving are his nieces, Debbie Jones and Sharon Jameson and their families and Tanya Perez (Ruben); his nephew, Dennis Wall (Karen) and their families and a special sister-in-law, Joann Wall of Acworth, Georgia.



JERRY TILLMAN

Jerry Tillman was born in Chatham County on October 10, 1940. He grew up near the Crutchfield's Crossroads area. Upon his father's passing when he was twelve, his mother remarried and he and his family lived in various places throughout the US... from California, Utah, and Louisiana, while his step-father honored his commitment to the US Army.

Jerry attended Elon College on a baseball scholarship. While there he was selected to All-State and All-Conference honors. He also made the All-American honorable mention selection his junior year at Elon. Jerry earned his degree in Education at Elon. He also met his future wife, Marian while at Elon. They married in December of 1963. After graduating with teaching degrees, they began their teaching careers together in Seagrove and settled in Asheboro.

After being selected Principal at Trindale Elementary in 1969, Jerry and Marian and their young son, Jeff, moved to Archdale from Asheboro that year. They also began attending Archdale Friends Meeting at that time. The family grew. Jerry, Marian, Jeff, Patrick, and Mary Elizabeth could usually be found on the second or third row, middle section, of Archdale Friends on Sunday mornings. Being up near the front of the church for an Isaac Harris sermon was not something to be missed.

Jerry went from his principalship at Trindale Elementary to a principalship at Archdale-Trinity Middle School in 1977. Jerry headed up that school for almost a decade before a promotion to the County Education Office. After retiring as Assistant Superintendent for Randolph County Schools, Jerry ran for, and was elected to, the NC State Senate. He represented Randolph County in the General Assembly for 18 years, serving as a State Senator from 2003 until his retirement from the General Assembly and subsequent appointment to the NC Board of Transportation in 2020. He served on the NC Board of Transportation up until his passing.

Jerry was a very active member of Archdale Friends for more than fifty years. He taught Sunday school, served on the Ministry and Council, served as Presiding Clerk and for many years served as a Finance Chair.

His wife, Marian, passed away in August of 2019. Jerry passed away on Feb. 4, 2023. He is survived by his 3 children along with their families which include nine grandchildren and one great grandchild.



H. S. SPENCER

H.S. was born May 10, 1927 in Randolph County, a son to Homer Sylvester Spencer, Sr. and Anne Delk Spencer. He was a veteran of the United States Navy, specializing in aircraft maintenance, and following his service, returned to this area where he remained his entire life.
