Colossians 1:24-29

In this text Paul describes various realities of his ministry. From this we saw various ways to assess our own ministries.

Do you agree with the idea that every Christian is called to “ministry?”

What are some areas in which God has you ministering? What are potential areas in which He might have you minister?

If you have been involved in “ministry,” what has been your favorite area of ministry?

Do you ever stop to assess your own ministry and how it is going?

Paul acknowledged that his ministry was not always easy and that he suffered as result of his ministry?

Have you ever faced any particular challenges in any area of ministry?

What do you think causes people to become discouraged in ministry?

When we face discouraging times in ministry, how can we be like Paul and still “rejoice?”

A vast amount of Paul’s ministry was focused on people who had not yet heard the Gospel.

Approximately how many non-business coffees/meals did you have with people this month? Approximately how many playdates did you have this month? How many of those were with non-christians?

Approximately how many conversations did you have with Christians in book clubs, bible studies, prayer groups, etc. this month? How many conversations did you have with non-christians?

One goal of Paul’s ministry was to present people mature in Christ.

Have you ever been discipled by another Christian? If so, what was that process like?

Have you ever discipled anyone? If so, what was that process like?
