Who is Mark?

Jewish church kid Acts 12:12 - Paul's co-worker 2 Tim 4:11
 Barnabas' nephew Col 4:10 - Peter's interpreter 1 Pet 5:13

- Missionary aide Acts 13:5 "A young man... ran away naked." Mark 14:51-52

Mark's Gospel is Peter's Gospel – "Mark was Peter's interpreter." Donald Guthrie

- Mark traveled extensively with Peter
- He knew Peter's preaching
- Mark was approached by church elders in Rome
- They asked him to write down Peter's accounts
- Mark did and then he edited them into ONE narrative

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Mark's Audience: Roman Christians

"Mark was writing for Romans who preferred action to words." Ralph Earle

- **Emphasizes** persecution
- **Explains Jewish customs**
- Uses local Latinisms
- Gets right to the point

Mark's Purposes - "Mark is a spiritual message for the church today." A.E.J. Rawlison

- Encourage the persecuted
- Evangelize the unsaved
- Teach the disciples
- Confront the heretics

Mark's Major Motion Picture

Peter's material Mark selected 106 narratives.

Nonstop activity Mark is the king of run-on sentences. (and,and,and,and,and) Sense of urgency Things happen rapidly, but with purpose, prayer and compassion.

No long discourses. Very few parables. Abrupt, frank, assertive, relentless Forceful style Touches of realism Looked around with anger (3:5); asleep on a pillow (4:38); green grass (6:39)

Dramatic Storyline

I. Jesus serves others

a. He works in Galilee chap 2-6 **b.** He works elsewhere chap 7-10

II. Jesus sacrifices himself

a. He gives his life for us chap 2-6 **b.** He continues working chap 7-10
