

## Small Groups Questions Exodus 4:18-5:23

Prayer Requests	
4.	Moses obeyed God in Exodus 5, yet things seemed to fall apart before his very eyes! Pharoah refused to let the Israelites go (5:1-13), Pharoah abused the Israelites even more harshly (5:14-19), and the Israelites turned on Moses and Aaron (5:20-21). What do you think the LORD was teaching Moses about obedience?
3.	The LORD made it clear in Exodus 4:23 that His purpose in redeeming the Israelites was <i>so they may worship/serve Me.</i> (The words "worship" and "serve" are the same Hebrew word.) The LORD repeats this purpose statement often. Read Exodus 4:23, 7:16, 8:1, 8:20, 9:1, 9:13, 10:3, 10:7-11, 10:24-26, 12:31. As you listen to these ten passages of purpose, what thoughts do they raise in your mind about worship?
2.	In Exodus 4:27-28, the LORD reconnected the brothers, Moses and Aaron, after 40 years. They went back to Egypt as a team of two (vv.29-31). What difference would this have made to Moses? How might this connect to Jesus' practice of sending out his disciples two by two (Mark 6:7, 10:1)? Who is your second? Your "Aaron"?
1.	Read Exodus 4:18-5:23 together. This passage is packed with different things the Lord might speak to us about. What stood out most to you?
