From the Pastor's Desk

"A Year of Rebuilding and Renewal"

As we begin to move through November and into a season of gratitude, I want to share with you a brief summary of the Report of Pastoral Ministry that I recently submitted to our Conference in preparation for Charge Conference on October 30. This report is something every United Methodist pastor completes each year — a way of reflecting on how God has been at work through our shared ministry.

This has been a year of rebuilding and renewal at Hampstead United Methodist Church. In the wake of so many transitions, we are finding our footing again — rediscovering who we are, who God is calling us to be, and how we can serve our neighbors with joy and hope. Worship attendance has been rising, with new families, baptisms, and professions of faith reminding us that the Holy Spirit is still moving among us.

Since last year's Charge Conference, seven children and youth have been baptized, and twelve adults have joined as professing members — one adult was baptized, seven adults joined by profession of faith and five by transfer from other churches. At the same time, thirty-seven members were removed from the rolls through withdrawal, transfer, or death, reflecting both the ongoing effects of denominational realignment and the natural rhythms of life in a changing congregation. Even so, these new faces, new commitments, and renewed energies point toward growth that is both spiritual and relational — a deepening of our identity as the Body of Christ here in Hampstead.

Our ministries are growing stronger because of the faithful laity who give their time, gifts, and prayers. This year, many of you have

stepped forward to serve as greeters, ushers, and scripture readers. Others have found new ways to serve through our Pumpkin Patch, Meals on Wheels, or the Share the Table partnership. Still others are leading in music, children's ministry, and community outreach. Truly, this is a church where everyone's gifts matter.

Through the Connect Church grant project, we will soon begin an intergenerational outreach ministry for children in the YMCA after-school program. This will give adults in our congregation the opportunity to mentor, create, and simply spend time with children who need to know they are loved and valued. It's a beautiful example of what it means to live out our faith together. Administratively, we've taken steps to strengthen our systems and finances for the long haul. The 40-month lease with the YMCA now covers the Family Life Center mortgage, ensuring stability while keeping our space open for ministry. Through your generosity and careful stewardship, our church remains faithful in paying **100% of our apportionments** — a tangible sign that we're still connected to the wider United Methodist family.

When I look back over this first full year as your pastor, I see God's hand in countless ways — in worship and laughter, in new faces and steady friendships, in quiet prayers and bold hopes for the future. We are not just surviving; we are **reviving**.

Thank you for being part of this journey of faith, for believing in what God is doing here, and for offering your hearts and hands in service. As we move toward Thanksgiving and Advent, may we continue to give thanks for what God has done and look forward — together — to what God will do next.
