

Sermon Discussion Questions
“I Promise”
Micah 7:9-20
October 9, 2016

1. Share a time when you were on the receiving end of a broken promise.
2. Micah 7:9 is a confession. 1 John 1:9 is an important verse in the New Testament, for it speaks of confession. Why is confession important in our human relationships? How can that teach us why it is important in our relationship with the Lord.
3. Micah 7:11-12 speaks of a kingdom that is coming. Read Isaiah 11:6 and 35:1-2 to get a feel for what will be experienced in that kingdom.
 - a. When you think of the Lord’s kingdom to come, Name the top 3 things you are most looking forward to and why?
4. Micah 7:13 is pretty harsh. Do you agree or disagree with what it says about the planet we are living on?
5. In Micah 7:14, Micah prays to the Lord to shepherd His flock. That was Israel then. According to these verses who is God’s flock today (1 Peter 5:2; Acts 20:28; and John 21:16)?
 - a. How do you know if you are a part of God’s flock?
 - b. If we are a part of God’s flock how should that influence our lives?
6. Jeremy shared about Mother Theresa’s struggle to feel like the Lord was her Shepherd. Can you relate at all with her feelings? Explain.
 - a. What does it take to feel like David did as he wrote Psalm 23?
 - i. How might these verses help us (Colossians 3:16; Hebrews 2:1; 3:12-13; 10:24-25)?
7. Take each of the four promises from your outline and discuss the impact they ought to have on each of us.
