II Corinthians 5:17-21

Read through II Corinthians 5:17-21

1. Faith has been defined as “the willingness to risk a situation on God.” What are some examples of this kind of faith you have witnessed at Faith Church? What new situations might God be calling the church to risk on Him?
2. Which of the following hesitations can you relate to when it comes to being an ambassador for Christ: I am an introvert, I don’t know enough about the Bible, I’m not very persuasive, I’m too new in the faith, I’m afraid of rejection. How did this sermon help you understand how you can still be involved in the process of bringing people to Jesus?
3. As ambassadors for Christ representing God’s kingdom in this world, what are some of His kingdom priorities we should be trying to further?
4. If you were to compile a list of people you would be willing to pray for concerning their salvation, how many would be on that list?
5. Think about some of the ways you could show the love of Jesus to unsaved people. Where do you think you should start?
6. Think of one or two individuals or families you could invite to something related to the church. Write down their name and next to it the activity you will invite them to, whether a worship service, Bible study, or some special event.
7. Think back to when you first visited Faith Church. How were you welcomed (or not) and what impact did it have on you? How might you change your practice toward people you don’t know on Sunday morning as a result of this sermon?
8. How does Romans 10:14 counter the argument of the person who says “I just try to share Jesus by example?”
9. How significant a percentage of people attending Faith Church on a Sunday morning may still be in need of being reconciled to God? What should the strategy be to bring them to a place of saving faith?
