#### Pastor's Column

#### "A Time to Cultivate"

Sitting on my back porch on Friday, June 20<sup>th</sup>, the Summer Solstice, I reflected on George Gershwin's familiar 1935 song from "Porgy & Bess" – "Summertime, When the Living is Easy." Summertime is a Season of growth, when the seeds planted and watered by abundant rain in Spring are sprouting and being cultivated into flowers to appreciate and produce to enjoy. Recently, I've been reading a book by Presbyterian minister, Jill Duffield, entitled, *Appreciate These Things: Eight Ways of Cultivating Compassion*. Duffield's book is based on a verse to the young church in Philippi comprised of a variety of people from a variety of backgrounds. Paul writes, "Brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these thing" (4:8). She suggests that we focus, meditate on, and appreciate these things – both in God's rich blessings of Creation and in God's blessings of the people He places in our lives – mentors, friends, family, etc.

Wow! If we could "renew our minds" as Paul suggests in Romans 12:2, by thinking about these things, it just might make a difference in all our relationships. In this tumultuous world, where so many seeds of hatred, anger, mistrust, and division are being planted and cultivated, it would be a powerful testimony to the love and grace of God, who cares about every human being, if we could be intentional with regard to "cultivating compassion." "Cultivation" requires daily nurture and care. And, this is certainly true spiritually. During these Summer days, may each of us take time to "cultivate compassion" by thinking on and appreciating all that is "true, honorable, just, etc." in God, and in others, so that, indeed, our gratitude toward God and appreciation of others will make our "living a little easier."



Session June 18, 2025

Session met for their stated June 18, 2025, meeting. All the elders and the moderator, Rev. Dale Williams, were present. Elder April Leese attended by zoom. Elder John Johnston led devotions and opened the meeting with prayer at 6:05 pm. The meeting agenda and the prior two meetings were

approved. Items from the June Presbytery Newsletter were reviewed. An annual Domestic Nonprofit Corporation report needs to be filed with the PA State Department by June 30. The most recent wording changes to the Book of Order have been made. The average pastoral tenure for the Carlisle Presbytery has gone from 14 years in 2014 to 8 years. The average weekly April worship attendance was forty.

Pastor Dale commented on his impression on the Holy Cow survey results. He prays for the Pastor Nominating Committee and was informed of homebound members and members in transition to new residences. A Resolution of Respect was approved for Elder Freda Cromer who joined the Church Triumphant on June 2, 2025. Her memorial service was held in the sanctuary on June 6, 2025, with the Rev. Dale Williams leading the service.

Elder Carolyn Kneas continues to work on the formation of the Flower Committee. Elder John Johnston updated the session on the first meeting of the PNC held June 11, 2025, for orientation by the presbytery's stated clerk, Rev. Kristal Smith. The Mission Review for our congregation and the Ministry Discernment Profile are two reports that will be completed and sent for presbytery Commission on Ministry approval. Then access to the Church Leadership Connection will be granted. Session will not meet during the month of July.

A communion schedule was amended for the remainder of the year. Communion will be celebrated on July 6, September 14(Rally Day), October 5(Worldwide Communion) and November 30 (First Sunday in Advent). An additional trained person is needed to operate the microphones and video camera for worship and special services.

This year's and last year's graduating seniors, Nevin Carbaugh, Will Dovey, Gavin Fowler, and Henry Alexander, will receive a Study Bible and a laundry bag with the MUPC logo in August. A May treasurer's report was accepted and approved.

Session approved the MUPC facility to serve as a back-up location for the Fulton County Family Partnership for students and staff should an emergency occur. Elder Dovey abstained from the vote. A session retreat will be held August 9, 2025. The purpose of the retreat is to seek methods to

expand our outreach program, take the Good News of the Gospel to the community and help grow the congregation. The Rev. Chris Elliott will be invited to the July 13 worship service to briefly speak on his mission project in Africa.

The meeting adjourned at 7:56 pm.
