Verse 11 begins with: But when Christ...."

- —I think it is easy to overlook these words, maybe it is easy to take these words for granted.
- ——"But Christ...", or "but God ...", are some of the most important words in the Bible because they usually remind us of our human condition, our brokenness, our desperate situation, or our ill fate just before these words are read.
- ———Let's take a minute to look at what God does when we see "but God...", or some form of it.
- ———READ: Ephesians 2:4–5 (NASB95): 4 But God, being rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, 5 even when we were dead in our transgressions, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved),
- ———READ: Romans 5:8 (NASB95): But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.
- ———READ: Matthew 19:26 (NASB95): 26 And looking at them Jesus said to them, "With people this is impossible, but with God all things are possible."
- ————READ: Acts 2:22–24 (NASB95): 22 "Men of Israel, listen to these words: Jesus the Nazarene, a man attested to you by God with miracles and wonders and signs which God performed through Him in your midst, just as you yourselves know— 23 this Man, delivered over by the predetermined plan and foreknowledge of God, you nailed to a cross by the hands of godless men and put Him to death. 24 "But God raised Him up again, putting an end to the agony of death, since it was impossible for Him to be held in its power.

Pink wrote, "So the priestly functions of Christ fall into two great divisions, as they were performed on earth and as they are now continued in heaven. Before our great High Priest could enter the Holiest on high and there make intercession before God, He had first to make an atonement for the sins of those He represented, which was accomplished in His state of abjection here below, being consummated by His offering Himself [as] a sacrifice unto God."

As we think about the blood of Christ, we have to recognize the effectiveness of that blood. -Murray wrote, "The infinite efficacy of Christ's blood, and the infinite blessedness of the cleansing it effects, can only be measured by what that blood really is." ——It is the blood of Christ that has the power to cleanse the conscience of humanity. ———<u>READ: 1 John 1:7 (NASB95)</u>: 7 but if we walk in the Light as He Himself is in the Light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin. ———READ: Ephesians 1:7 (NASB95): 7 In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace ———<u>READ: Colossians 1:19–20 (NASB95)</u>: 19 For it was the Father's good pleasure for all the fullness to dwell in Him, 20 and through Him to reconcile all things to Himself, having made peace through the blood of His cross; through Him, I say, whether things on earth or things in heaven.

Scripture:	
	The blood of Christ helps us see that Christ was perfectly obedient.  —READ: Philippians 2:8 (NASB95): 8 Being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.  —READ: John 14:30–31 (NASB95): 30 "I will not speak much more with you, for the ruler of the world is coming, and he has nothing in Me; 31 but so that the world may know that I love the Father, I do exactly as the Father commanded Me. Get up, let us go from here.  —The Eternal Spirit, the Holy Spirit, led Christ as He leads us as well.  ——READ: Luke 4:1–2 (NASB95): Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led around by the Spirit in the wilderness 2 for forty days, being tempted by the devil. And He ate nothing during those days, and when they had ended, He became hungry.  ———God gives us the same Spirit to lead and guide us.
	Christ's blood is so precious to God.  —Murray wrote, "That Life gave His blood, each drop of it, an infinite value. The blood of a man is of more worth than that of sheep. The blood of a king or great general is counted of more value than handles of common soldiers. The blood of the Son of God! It is in vain that the mind seeks for some expression of its value; all we can say is that it is His own blood, the precious blood of the Son of God!"  ——This precious blood opened the physical grave and then it opened up heaven so that those who believe could dwell with God.

	So, what is our take away? What is our practical application for all that we have heard today?  —A cleansed conscience and cleansed heart is how we go from dead works to serving God.  —Dead works are these things that we do through our own efforts, our own sinful ways, through our own understanding of moral and religious works.  ——"But Christ" removes our dead works and give us the freedom to serve God.  ———Pink wrote, "The 'living God' cannot be served by those who are dead in sins, and therefore alienated from Him. But the sacrifice of Christ has purchased the gift of the Spirit unto all for whom He died, and the Spirit renews and equips the saint for acceptable worship."  ————Those that are redeemed by the blood of Christ are those that serve God with joy and fulfillment.  ————What is your service to God revealing about your conscience/heart?
