A Word from Pastor Chad


Dear Church Family,

The modern-day church has a pressing need. One that is quite honestly a simple fix, yet for some reason the task looms over us like a dark storm cloud. What is this pressing need? Being ready at all times for the good work of sharing the Gospel with anyone and everyone. We may have a basic understanding of the Gospel and may even be able to share that understanding with others, but my prayer, as your pastor, is that each and every one of you would be fully equipped, able to give a Biblical answer at all times (1 Peter 3:15). Perhaps one of the best ways to do that is through the Romans Road. It is a great way to give a Biblical Gospel presentation, and I also believe memorizing it can keep us growing in our faith as well!

STOP 1: Romans 3:23, "... for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God..." The term "Gospel" means "good news". The good news is good because there is... bad news. The bad news is that no one is righteous. We are all in need of a Savior. This truth reminds us that none of us deserve salvation, it is a gift of God. That means we shouldn't try to determine who we think is worthy of the gospel or not... Everyone needs to hear! God set the standard for righteousness and none of us have achieved that standard, except Christ.

STOP 2: Romans 5:8, "... but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." God loved us even though we were undeserving— even though all people are undeserving— He displayed his unconditional love. This stop in Romans reminds us that Jesus Christ, as the only one able to achieve the perfect standard of a Holy God, became the payment that made it possible for us to be right with God.

STOP 3: Romans 6:23, "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life through Jesus our Lord." Remember there is a reason the Gospel is called the good news and stop 3 continues to unravel the initial bad news. The penalty of not achieving the standard of a Holy God is death. However, this verse doesn't stop there. We do see the good news! Even though our sin required death, God has sent His Son to die on the cross, making the payment that our sin required. Therefore, in contrast to death, we see the gift is eternal life.



STOP 4: Romans 8:1, "There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus." Praise God that because Jesus lived the perfect and sinless life that we could never live, and because He died in our place for our sins, which He never committed, we are no longer condemned by our own failure. Christ made it possible for believers to be seen as righteous before our Holy God.

Global Groaning

There's rarely a news article written today, either about the weather or the environment, that does not include "global warming" in its contents. In fact, there's much in the news about the state of things on planet earth, most of it alarming and dire.

Long before today's nations got ahold of this concept of global warming, there was a little-known apostle writing letters to churches in faraway places about the state of things, all things. Only there was no alarm whatsoever in his communication. On the contrary, the tone of his letters was filled with exuberant expectation and pregnant hope, even glory.

Sometime during the winter of 57 AD, the Apostle Paul took pen in hand and wrote his letter to Romans. It is one of the most vital, theologically vibrant books in the Bible. Of course, it was the Holy Spirit dictating to Paul how things really are—what are the real and actual state of things, not the conjecture and hypotheses of mere men.

Here's a peek into what's really underway in the world... "For the anxious longing of the creation waits eagerly for the revealing of the sons of God. For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of Him who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself also will be set free from its slavery to corruption into the freedom of the glory of the children

of God. For we know that the whole creation groans and suffers the pains of childbirth together until now." Romans 8:19-22.

By revelation, Paul saw that the grand works of God actually included a groaning earth. Yes. Things are not as they will be, yet all our groaning is pointing to the birth of a new creation; new heavens and a new earth, where the pinnacle of creation is the revealing of the sons of God. So rather than global warming, the earth is groaning.

Oh, so all the groaning we see in the earth today is actually leading somewhere glorious? Yes. That God's master plan is something much bigger and more glorious than all this? That this was all part of His glorious plan even before the foundation of the world? Yes! Oh, and it includes freedom from futility? Oh my, yes! That's the truth.

You probably won't hear this in the news. There's no need to fret and worry about where everything on earth is going. God knows. Everything is perfectly on schedule. Just like childbirth: the birth pangs increase until the child comes out of the womb. And while we all wait, even creation is full of anticipation, joyous waiting, as if standing on the tip of its toes looking for the arrival of our King. Wait and see! Everything is exactly on time and will happen just like it's written in the Bible.



There's good news here again! If you have placed your faith in the work of Christ on the cross, you do not need to live with the burden of guilt because of your sin!
Rather, you can know that Christ made you righteous before God and we are now free to live for Him!

STOP 5: Romans 10:9, "... because if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved." Our final stop, the reality of it all, where the bad news and the good news all come together. Do you believe that you have fallen short of the glory of God? Do you believe that your sin does require death? Do you believe that Christ made that payment on your behalf so you can have life in His name? Do you believe that

Christ has removed the guilt associated with your sin? Glory to God, Jesus is the good news, there is salvation in Him!

While these five verses aren't the "end all" in a Gospelcentered conversation, they certainly do provide a wonderful baseline for all believers to start at. Having an understanding of these principles can help you share the Gospel with anyone at any time. We have some Romans Road bookmarks available to remind you of each of the stops along the way!


