A Word from Pastor Chad

Dear Church Family,

Desolate places can be understood as "the wilderness." Jesus showed the importance of "QT" (Quiet Time), and we need it too! Spend time daily in prayer, whether you are in the "wilderness" or not, but don't let the busyness of the season distract you from your "QT" with Christ!

David has a song of thanksgiving to the Lord in 1 Chronicles 16. I love the entire prayer (1 Chronicles 16:8-36) but I want to focus on verses 8-11. He says, "Oh give thanks to the LORD; call upon His name; make known His deeds among the peoples! Sing to Him, Sing praises to Him; tell of all His wondrous works! Glory in His holy name; let the hearts of those who SEEK the LORD rejoice! SEEK the LORD and His strength; SEEK His presence continually!"

The Simplicity of Showing UP

The table was set for five. Four chairs for the women who signed up to study Ephesians and one for me. Perfect.

The four women arrived a little early. Then two more arrived. Then another. Then three. Then four more. Two more. They kept coming until 20 women squeezed in around the table. My heart was bursting with joy for the Lord.

After the women introduced themselves; where they were from and their religious backgrounds, I shared how the study would be approached. One woman on my left, said she wanted to know what I thought about predestination, because she didn't think it was fair for God to choose some and reject others just because they didn't believe in Him. Then her friend chimed in and said she too was always put off by that word and since Paul makes such a big deal of it in the first chapter, she wanted to know what that meant. A few women offered their take on predestination and the night was off with a bang!! You can imagine the chatter with a room full of Presbyterians, Baptists, Assemblies of God, Methodists, and several non-denominational believers all wanting to discuss the meaning of "that" word! After the dust settled, they all turned to me and waited for my take.

It was a pregnant moment for me. Just a few weeks prior, I left Boise without the slightest idea how things would unfold. After I arrived in Desert Hot Springs, CA, I wasn't sure what ministry opportunities would arise. God knew. I knew to wait on Him. When I asked if I could teach a Bible study, the activities director was thrilled. Then I learned several women were actually praying for someone to arrive who would teach a study. Then here we are, all eyes on me to settle the controversy over a confounding theological concept called predestination. Talk about a pregnant moment.

I smiled, then proceeded to share with them the importance of beginning with God. What happens when we begin with

ourselves? Our opinions, the opinions of others and our past experiences can cloud our interpretation of Scripture. What is God's intent? What does God have in mind in having the Apostle Paul write this letter of Ephesians? Is there something in that word "predestined" that God intends for us to know so we will see His heart toward us? Then I quoted Isaiah 55:9, "For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are My ways higher than your ways and My thoughts than your thoughts."

As I looked around the room, women were leaning in and quiet. There was awe for God being restored to their minds. Even the two women who stubbed their toes on "that" word, realized that maybe there was more to see. They were at least intrigued.

For the next three months, we unpacked the significance of those amazing verses in Chapter 1 of the Letter to Ephesians. I witnessed the Lord changing women's hearts. I saw women discover for the very first-time truths about God and His word that actually answered so many true longings they didn't even know they had. At the end of every evening, one of the women would say, "Am I the only one in the room that's never heard this before?" And with that, heads would nod, and laughter would arise to the glory of God.

Nestled in Paul's letter are these amazing words, "For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we would walk in them." Ephesians 2:10. No one needs to convince me that God determined in advance of my arrival in Desert Hot Springs that a Bible study would be taught to precious women who would come to realize more fully His love for them. Absolutely! All I needed to do was simply show up! Glory to God! And Donnelly Bible Church, thank you for sending me out there! Sood NEWS


DBC Ladies Ministry

DBC Financial Update

The financials for the first quarter for Donnelly Bible Church showed us being behind expected receipts by \$17,425. We had anticipated incoming tithing for the first quarter at \$63,144 while actual tithe receipts came in at \$45,720.

A little bit of explanation here about the budget: Basically, the Church budget is the breakdown of what is needed to keep the Church operational for a year. This includes salaries, operating expenses, building repairs, care team and hospitality work, missions support, etc. We then divide that cost over the twelve months in the year. However, costs don't always fall that systematically. Please pray that the funds continue to come in to support the Lord's work in our Church. **Proverbs 3:9 "Honor the Lord with your wealth, with the first fruits of all your crops."**




The Food Pantry


Kathy "Sue" Stewart 1955-2023






Talon will be attending Boise State University this fall. He plans on majoring in Business with a minor in Construction Management.
