We are in a new week for our 40 Days Through God's Story. (See the Gospel Story by Memory page under Events/40 Days God's Story).

1) **Review the Gospel Story Actions:** God Rules – We Sin – God Promises – Jesus Rescues – We Answer.... And now this week we are learning that God Gives. The action is to raise both hands up in the air and wiggle your fingers like rain while you bring your hands to your shoulders.

When we follow Jesus,

- God gives us the Holy Spirit to help us obey God and help us love Jesus more and more.
- God gives us the Bible to tell His story and guide our lives.
- He gives us the church family for encouragement.
- 2) **Share the story of Pentecost:** This is a Bible story about the first time God gave the Holy Spirit as a helper to live inside ALL his disciples it was a day we call Pentecost.

Read Acts 2:1-13 about how the Holy Spirit Comes at Pentecost

Read Acts 2:14-41 about Peter's first message empowered by the Holy Spirit

Storybook Style From the Laugh and Learn Bible for Kids by Paul Vischer pg 293-297 "God's Super Helper"

For Jesus friends, there was good news and bad news.

The good news: Jesus was alive! The bad news: Jesus was leaving.

Now it was up to them to spread the word about God's kingdom. As soon as Jesus told them this, He disappeared into the sky. But there was still more news – good news AND bad news.

More good news: He promised to send them a Helper!

More bad news: they had no idea who that Helper was or how He would help them.

And worse, Jesus' friends were scared. The Jewish leaders – the Sadducees and the Pharisees – had arrested Jesus. What if they decided to arrest Jesus' friends too?

All of Jesus' friends were meeting together to pray. They were trying not to attract too much attention, so they wouldn't get in trouble. One day passed. Then two days. Then three. There was no sign of the "Helper" that Jesus had promised them. Four days passed. Five days. Six days. Nothing. And then...

BOOM! It was the tenth day since Jesus had left, and all His friends were praying together in one big room. Suddenly a sound like a huge wind filled the house! It was pretty weird. But then things got even WEIRDER. Little flames of fire – not actual fire, but something that looked like fire – appeared in the air and came down over each one of their heads while they prayed! It was the HOLY SPIRIT! The Spirit of God! *Remember when Jesus was baptized?* Something that looked like a dove came down from the sky and rested on Jesus. It was the Spirit of God, coming to show that

God's power was with Jesus. And now that same thing was happening to Jesus' friends. These little flames of fire were a sign that God's power was now with each one of them!

What kind of power? Well, the first thing that happened was that everyone in the room began speaking in different languages – languages they didn't even know! This was really helpful, because Jews who spoke many different languages were visiting Jerusalem that week from all over the Roman world. Suddenly all these visitors heard Jesus' friend speaking to them in their own language! Then the Holy Spirit gave Jesus' disciple Peter the power to stand up and speak an amazing message about who Jesus was. After Peter proclaimed the good news that day, nearly 3.000 people who heard him speak became followers of Jesus! Suddenly, Jesus' disciples, the same ones who had been hiding together to stay out of trouble, were bravely talking about Jesus all over Jerusalem.

"Stop talking about Jesus or we'll arrest you too!" the Sadducees and Pharisees threatened. But the disciples didn't care. Filled with God's power, they were now the bravest people on earth! This wasn't the first time God's Spirit had filled someone with power. Kings like Saul and David had been filled with the Spirit of God. And some of Israel's judges and prophets were filled with God's power when there was a big job to do. But before now, only certain people at certain times were filled with the Spirit of God. And if they disobeyed God, like King Saul did, God's Spirit was taken away.

This was very different. Jesus didn't just send the Holy Spirit to help a few special people do a few special things. This was much better than that! Now, for the first time ever, God's Spirit and God's power were available to ALL of Jesus' friends. And not just for a little while. FOREVER.

Yep, Jesus changed EVERYTHING. He didn't leave His friends alone. Instead, He gave them a "superpower" – the power of the Holy Spirit – so they could go out and change the world.

4) Family Connection: God's Super Helper. Acts 2

Tricky bits: Who is our Helper?

Remember the Trinity? God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is our Helper. When we give our hearts to Jesus, He puts His Holy Spirit inside us. The Holy Spirit helps us pray and helps us understand the bible. The Holy Spirit helps us love God and obey Him. When we need help, we can stop to listen or feel what He is saying or how He is leading us.

Talk:

- Why do you think God used fire to show His super power?
- How can you use God's super power in your life?

Pray:



Activity: Balloon Rocket – you can't see the Holy Spirit – just like you can't see air but can feel the wind.

If you happen to have these supplies at home, this activity might be a bit of fun: balloons, straws, long piece of string that fits through the straw and allows lots of movement, tape.

← Unlike the picture... don't tie the balloon closed for this activity.


This balloon rocket whooshes across the room. How is this rocket with a balloon motor made? Take a small tube and thread it onto a rope. Stretch the rope across the room. If possible use a smooth rope with a smooth surface. Inflate the balloon and stick it to the tube with tape or masking tape. Let go of the balloon.

Hints for youth club session:

You can give the children all the materials and get them to devise a way of getting the balloon from A to B in a straight a line as possible. It will be interesting to see if they can come up with the solution. Then maybe try balloon races..,.

A spiritual tip:

- We can't see the Holy Spirit -just like air
- But if we become a follower of Jesus, the Holy Spirit still moves us into action and gives us strength even though we can't see Him.
- Without Jesus we are like a balloon without air.
