Status Update: April 14, 2020

- With the extension of the Stay at Home Executive Order by Minnesota Gov. Walz until May 4, 2020, all scheduled Lake Beauty retreats and Guest Group events for that time period are cancelled or postponed.
- · Summer camp registrations remain open.
- Early Bird discounts have been extended to May 4th.
- Staff are using enhanced sanitization procedures to ensure increased disinfecting of high use and high touch areas.

Diana: Please pray for the kids at the detention center.

On Christ, the solid rock, I stand; all other ground is sinking sand, all other ground is sinking sand.


- 2. When darkness veils his lovely face, I rest on his unchanging grace; in ev'ry high and stormy gale, my anchor holds within the veil. [Refrain]

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.


