Scripture Reading: Romans 10: 1-13

Romans 10:1-13 New International Version (NIV)

Brothers and sisters, my heart's desire and prayer to God for the Israelites is that they may be saved. For I can testify about them that they are zealous for God, but their zeal is not based on knowledge. Since they did not know the righteousness of God and sought to establish their own, they did not submit to God's righteousness. Christ is the culmination of the law so that there may be righteousness for everyone who believes.

Moses writes this about the righteousness that is by the law: "The person who does these things will live by them." But the righteousness that is by faith says: "Do not say in your heart, 'Who will ascend into heaven?'" (that is, to bring Christ down) "or 'Who will descend into the deep?'" (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). But what does it say? "The word is near you; it is in your mouth and in your heart," that is, the message concerning faith that we proclaim: If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved. As Scripture says, "Anyone who believes in him will never be put to shame." For there is no difference between Jew and Gentile—the same Lord is Lord of all and richly blesses all who call on him, for, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

We are in a new week for our 40 Days Through God's Story. (See the Gospel Story by Memory page under Events/40 Days God's Story).

- 1) **Review the Gospel Story Actions:** God Rules We Sin God Promises Jesus Rescues.... And now this week we are learning that We Answer. Jesus offers to rescue us, and we give him an answer. The action is to raise one hand up high (like you want to answer a question at school).
 - We need to accept Jesus' rescue and repent, turning from self and sin to Jesus.
 - We can either choose to disobey or we can choose to follow Jesus and let Him be the ruler of our lives.
- 2) Share the story of Zacchaeus and how He Answered Jesus. This is a Bible story that shows us what can happen when we see Jesus and repent (giving up our selfishness and following Jesus instead).

From Luke 19:1-10 New Living Translation (NLT)

Jesus entered Jericho and made his way through the town. There was a man there named Zacchaeus.

He was the chief tax collector in the region, and he had become very rich. He tried to get a look at Jesus, but he was too short to see over the crowd.

So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore-fig tree beside the road, for Jesus was going to pass that way.

When Jesus came by, he looked up at Zacchaeus and called him by name. "Zacchaeus!" he said. "Quick, come down! I must be a guest in your home today."

Zacchaeus quickly climbed down and took Jesus to his house in great excitement and joy. But the people were displeased. "He has gone to be the guest of a notorious sinner," they grumbled.

Meanwhile, Zacchaeus stood before the Lord and said, "I will give half my wealth to the poor, Lord, and if I have cheated people on their taxes, I will give them back four times as much!"

Jesus responded, "Salvation has come to this home today, for this man has shown himself to be a true son of Abraham. For the Son of Man came to seek and save those who are lost."
