There's not a lot we know of the man Luke.

1. What do you remember from Sunday about Luke? Why was it helpful to know a little about him before jumping in to the rest of this Gospel?
2. What did he do?
3. How much of the NT did he write?

READ: Acts 16:6-10

4. Where might Luke have been from?
5. How did he end up with Paul?
6. How did a non-apostle, non-Jew, end up writing so much of the NT?

Whether you join up with a traveling missionary (like Paul) or you serve Christ through your church within your community, we can follow Luke's example.

7. Do you see yourself limited? Have you ever said, “I could never do that”? Can you ever imagine God using you in ways that only He could put together? Are you willing? Anything holding you back from full surrender? 1 Peter 4:10-11

8. What do we learn of Paul's relationship with Luke from the few times he's mentioned?

Philemon 23-24; Col 4:14; 2 Tim 4:9-11

Imagine, taking what you've learned, who you are today, and being on a team like this. Telling the Original Good News for All! What's holding you back? Ask for prayer and then look for opportunity! (Good time for Grace Groups to discuss Ministry Projects for this semester!)

9. What's the main message of Luke? (see title!)

10. Every time PM starts a new book we always go to Rom 15:4. Why? What does it tell us?
