

“When God Does the Impossible!”

Luke 1:39-80

Impossibilities. Miracles. Do we see any? Are they happening? By definition, we're saying impossibilities like the ones in our passage are categorized as “Only God”.

1. Think Biblically. Consider other (outside of our passage) Bible stories of God's work that we'd say, “Only God” and share some examples and insights.
Example: Moses crossing the sea.
2. What are some of the characteristics of the impossibilities you came up with?
3. How much do we believe Luke 1:37 for today?

One of the fears we have of a topic like this is straying off course to some extreme abuses of how people talk of God's supernatural work today. Don't do that.

4. Both Mary and Elizabeth knew God and trusted Him for the impossibilities. Talk about the differences between these two ladies. Backgrounds, family. How do you relate to one or the other?
5. What characteristics are seen of Mary in her response in vs 46-56? Why is this commonly called the Magnificat? What does Mary say God did for her?
6. How was Zechariah's response similar and different with Mary's?
7. How important is God's faithfulness to Israel from these passages?
8. How do we see God's work around us today?

Look for God's activity. Keep your eyes open and then write it down, share it. Thank God for it.

Pray for God's work to be done. What would tomorrow look like if God answered your prayers for tomorrow? Who would be impacted?

Live like you believe in God doing the impossibilities. A life of trust and faith says, "Only God"!
