7. How did John teach the newly repentant to change their lifestyle? 3:10-14

Why did this matter?

8. When a person today trusts in Jesus' work at the cross and they become born again, how might their behavior be different? Why is this important?

9. What does Eph 2:8-10 tell us about our salvation and our good works? What kinds of things in your life have changed as you have grown in your understanding of the Scriptures?

10. What did John say about Jesus who was coming after Him? How might this help us as we learn to talk about Jesus?
