

House Church Gathering Discussion Questions

Sunday January 25, 2026

“Go and Tell What You’ve Seen”

Scripture: John 4:28–30, 39

28 Then, leaving her water jar, the woman went back to the town and said to the people, 29 “Come, see a man who told me everything I ever did. Could this be the Messiah?” 30 They came out of the town and made their way toward him.”

39 Many of the Samaritans from that town believed in him because of the woman’s testimony, “He told me everything I ever did.”

Summary: We often believe that sharing our faith requires confidence, clarity, and airtight answers. We think evangelism belongs to pastors, theologians, or people who have their lives perfectly together. But in John 4, the gospel spreads not through a sermon...

Not through a miracle...

Not through a religious debate...

It spreads through a woman with a story. She didn’t have a creed memorized. She didn’t understand Christology. She didn’t even know for sure who Jesus was yet. She simply said: “Come and see.” And that was enough.

Discussion Questions:

1. Think about your own faith journey. What is one moment, season, or experience where you clearly encountered Jesus in a personal way? Why do you think personal stories can sometimes speak more powerfully than explanations or arguments?
2. The Samaritan woman’s past did not disqualify her from being used by God. What are some fears, doubts, or feelings of inadequacy that keep people (including you) from sharing their faith? How does this story challenge those assumptions?
3. Who is one person in your everyday life—family, friend, coworker, or neighbor—whom God may be inviting you to simply *invite* rather than convince? What might a natural, pressure-free invitation look like this week?

Leader tip: End by inviting the group to pray for courage and openness, not results—trusting God with the outcome.
