“Come and See the New Creation God is Making”

Scripture: Revelation 21:1-5

Then I saw “a new heaven and a new earth,” for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and there was no longer any sea. ² I saw the Holy City, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride beautifully dressed for her husband. ³ And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, “Look! God’s dwelling place is now among the people, and he will dwell with them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God. ⁴ ‘He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death’ or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away.”

⁵ He who was seated on the throne said, “I am making everything new!” Then he said, “Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true.”

Summary: “Come and See the New Creation God Is Making” is a message from Revelation 21:1–5 that reminds believers God is not finished with the world or with us. Through Jesus Christ, God is already making all things new—restoring broken lives, healing wounded hearts, and bringing hope to weary people. Revelation 21 points to the future promise of a new heaven and new earth where God dwells with His people forever, pain and death are removed, and joy is complete. The message encourages believers to live with hope, confidence, and expectation because the same God who will one day renew all creation is already at work renewing lives today.

Discussion Questions:

1. What part of the promise in Revelation 21:1–5 speaks most deeply to you right now, and why?
2. The sermon says God is already making all things new today. Where have you personally seen God bring renewal, healing, or restoration in your life or in someone else’s life?
3. How can living with the hope of God’s future kingdom change the way we handle fear, disappointment, suffering, or uncertainty in our everyday lives?
