Packages of Hope

For each Bible Crew, wrap four or five paper or plastic cups stacked together in tissue paper, like a gift. Then cut out the first slip below and tape it to the top of the package. Then wrap the package again and tape the second slip below to the top of the package. Wrap the package a third time and tape the third slip below to the top of the package. Then wrap the package again and tape the fourth slip below to the top of the package one more time.



Read John 4:19-26, and discuss this question with your group:

What does it mean to worship God in spirit and in truth?

How can we do that?



Read John 4:9-13, and discuss this question with your group:

What promises did Jesus give to the woman?

What promises does God give to us?



Read John 4:14-18, and discuss this question with your group:

Think of a secret that you might try to keep from God. You may share it with your group if you'd like, or you can keep it to yourself.

How does it make you feel to know that God knows everything about you and loves you completely?



Read John 4:1-8, and discuss this question with your group:

When have you been really, really thirsty?

What did you do?

Nater What's the best thing to drink when you're really, really thirsty? Cool, fresh water. Read JOHN 4:1-26 to see what Jesus said about special living water! WOW! Jesus said he could offer people living water. That living water is Jesus himself! Because Jesus died on the cross for our sins, we can live forever in heaven. That's what living water is all about. FIND A FRIEND, AND TOGETHER CREATE A COMMERCIAL FOR THE LIVING WATER OF JESUS You could draw a poster, act out a skit, or record your voices. Make your commercial as convincing as you can.
