

PARENT INFORMATION FOR AWANA 2025-2026

IMPORTANT NOTES

All clubbers need to wear tennis shoes to AWANA. This makes game time on the AWANA mat much easier for everyone.

Awana Clubs begin at **6:40pm**. You may sign-in beginning at 6:30pm.

Theme nights are marked on the calendar with a description on the back of the calendar. "Regular Club" means no theme or special focus for that night.

WORKBOOKS, BAGS, & ETC.

While Grace provides our equipment, facilities, occasional treats, all awards and club supplies, each Clubber is asked to pay (**at cost only**) for their workbooks, vests or t-shirts, and book bags. Each clubber is also asked to bring 25¢ weekly dues (*to help instill a sense of responsibility and ownership*).

- For easier bookkeeping, **we ask that payment be made BEFORE these materials are given to your child(ren)**. If you have any questions, please see your child's club secretary.

DROP OFF & PICK UP

Both of these times can be very chaotic at Grace! The biggest challenge we have is at the end of clubs, making sure that each child is with the adult responsible for them.

- ALL clubbers will sign **IN AND OUT** in their respective areas. At dismissal, **no child will be released until signed out by a parent/designated responsible adult**.

Please be prompt in picking up your children at 8:15pm. Our workers in every age group also have children that they must go sign out.

Please park in marked parking spots only when dropping off or picking up your child. There are plenty of marked parking spaces on the Littlejohn Road-side and at the back of the building.

CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

This policy at Grace requires that anyone working with minors (ages 0 - 18 years of age) go through an application process and background check. No issues precipitated this, but we want to be faithful, careful stewards and protectors of the children God has entrusted to us. As a result, every AWANA worker has been through this process.
