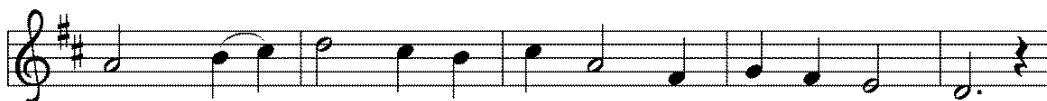

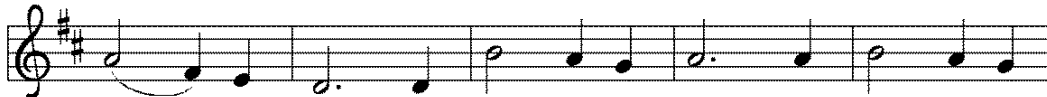

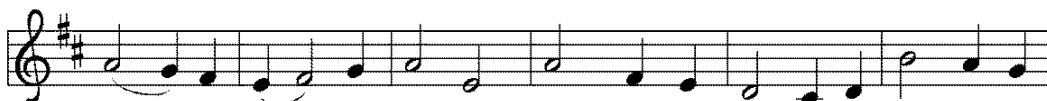

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Second Reading: 1 John 3:16-24

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RECEPTION OF FIRST HOLY COMMUNION
