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#### **NICENE CREED**






Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying:

To you, O God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory in your holy church, now and forever.






#### THE DISTRIBUTION

Please let your Communion Minister know if you wish to receive a gluten free wafer. Please follow the guidance of the ushers.




As we await your coming, we give thanks for the faithful who have lived and died in faith. May their boldness of faith inspire our witness and work. God of grace, hear our prayer.




