



Community Foundation of Pulaski County (CFPC) 2019 GRANTS and GUIDELINES

Community Foundation of Pulaski County accepts grant proposals on a **continuous basis**. There are no specific deadlines for submitting applications. However, to assist organizations in their planning, applications will be reviewed quarterly. 2019 quarterly deadlines are: March 25, June 24, September 23, and December 23. Please keep in mind that it may take approximately six to eight weeks to review proposals and contact you with an initial response.

Please review these Grant Guidelines to ensure your project fits within them. Some grants have specific guidelines, found on the Grants page of the CF website. You are encouraged to contact the CFPC office to discuss your project before beginning. Applications must be submitted online.

Types of CFPC Grants:

- **Youth** – *for youth organizations seeking grants up to \$500 to improve existing programs or create new youth projects in the school or community.*
- **Field of Interest Grants** – *three grants are available for specific charitable purposes: adult education; educationally disadvantaged children/adults; wildlife conservation and education. Grant amounts vary.*
- **Community Grants** – *for organizations seeking grants up to several thousand dollars. These are designed to be awarded to several organizations, providing support throughout Pulaski County.*
- **Sustainability Grants** - *for 501(c)(3) organizations who wish to create their own endowment fund in the Community Foundation. A \$5,000 matching grant can enable an organization to establish a \$10,000 permanent endowment and provide a stable source of income for its mission.*

CFPC grants shall serve Pulaski County and its communities. Specific requirements pertaining to each type of grant are included on the individual applications.

Final reports are required of all grantees in order to be considered for future grant funding.
