We hope you'll join us in praying that our whole congregation will grow in our understanding of the gifts God has given us and our confidence in using them for the sake of a world in need.
















### Finance Ministry



YTD March, we had receipts of \$211,717 which was 106% of our budgeted receipts of \$198,966 and 11% higher than 2023. Contributions are up 7% vs 2023 and we are collecting approximately \$3k each month in mutual fund interest that was implemented in July 2023. Expenses were \$223,061 and \$986 unfavorable to plan due to plumbing repairs in education wing.

Significant YTD expense variances explained below:

- Synod expense is favorable \$1,914 as 2024 Synod Assembly will be virtual so no accommodations are needed.
- Property expenses are unfavorable \$2,892 due to plumbing repairs in the Education wing.
- Admin expense is unfavorable \$1,887 due to Janitorial supplies which continue to experience ongoing increases.

#### **NEW COMMUNION CHALICES!**

During worship on Maundy Thursday we put into use for the first time a new set of wine chalices for Holy Communion. These silver-plated chalices with gold basins are hand-made in the USA by Alviti Creations and have been graciously given to the glory of God by members of Epiphany. They replace our old set of chalices, which have become scratched and rusty and are no longer fit for use. We are grateful for these new chalices, which will bear the wine of Christ's new covenant in our worship for years to come.

Beginning sometime after Easter we will no longer be printing people's names in a prayer list in our Sunday worship bulletin. This is a return to an earlier, long-standing practice. We will still maintain an updated prayer list in the church office and with the pastors, but due to privacy concerns, bulletin space, and a better way of keeping track of prayer requests, there is no longer any pressing need to include a bulletin list. 


Table Talk: Grandparenting Today! 10 am Bonhoeffer Room Sunday, April 28

Our next regular meeting will be Wednesday April 10 in the Parlor. We will try to match baby pictures to our Circle sisters!




#### **EASTER BASKETS HUGE SUCCESS!**


#### **April Showers**



Russ did his usual power washing thing, and it shows!




