





## February 2026

Every May a group of high school students stands in front of the congregation and makes public profession of their faith. Known as confirmation, this ceremony provides these young people with the opportunity to affirm their baptisms and say “yes” to continuing in the life of the church. As one new member of the congregation put it to me recently over a cup of coffee, “Confirmation is where the church looks at these kids and asks, ‘So are you really going to go through with this?’” This individual had not grown up churched, nor had he been confirmed himself, but he was pretty perceptive. Confirmation can often feel like a rite that you’ve earned, but it’s really a moment where your commitment is being tested: Are really you going to go through with this “faith stuff” as you enter adulthood?



Truth be told, God gives us umpteen moments throughout our lives (and throughout each day, in fact) where our faith comes into play. We know God is always faithful to us, and we know God’s promises of forgiveness and eternal life are trustworthy and true. Our baptism can never be undone. But can we perceive our opportunities to respond to that grace that clearly? How do we live into the promise we have made to live our faith like we mean it? What shape does our side of the covenant take? Wouldn’t it be nice if we had some simple list to know what “really going through with this” looked like?

Lucky for us, we do! The rite of confirmation, in fact, outlines the life of baptism in five succinct but rich promises, promises we agree to with God’s help and guidance. We hear them each May, but perhaps a little extra “refresher” is good once in a while. Therefore this Lent we will return to the basic promises of baptism, that fount of every blessing:

- To live among God’s faithful people
- To hear God’s word and share in the Lord’s supper
- To proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed
- To serve all people, following the example of Jesus
- To strive for justice and peace in all the world

Succinct but rich. Easy but hard. Basic but complex. Exacting but life-giving. These are the things we agree to do every time we say “yes” to God’s “yes” for us. Come on Wednesday evenings at 7pm to worship in our sanctuary and reflect as a community on these five promises of our new life in Christ. And join on Sundays as we delve into them a little deeper in Sunday School.

I look forward to seeing you and thinking together about the fount of every blessing this Lent. *Streams of mercy, never ceasing, call for hymns of loudest praise.*

Attention all Epiphany staff members and ministry team chairs.





Due to the generosity of our congregation, our receipts for the year were \$959,942 which was 99% of our budgeted receipts of \$962,000 and \$70,401 or 8% higher than 2024.

Expenses were \$963,343 and \$1,343 unfavorable to plan primarily due to:

- Several PC upgrades to accommodate Windows update
- Property due to cost of goods and services
- Copier supply cost higher than planned



Hello Members of Epiphany Lutheran Church,

My name is Ryan Urban, and I am a Life Scout with Scouts BSA Troop 804 in Midlothian, Virginia. I am currently working toward the rank of Eagle Scout, and as part of this process, I am planning a service project that supports children and adults in our local community who may be sensory-sensitive or sensory-seeking.

My Eagle Scout Service Project will provide sensory utility carts to four elementary schools and one public library in the greater Richmond area. These carts will be equipped with sensory tools designed to help individuals with ADHD, Autism, Down Syndrome, dementia, and other sensory or cognitive needs, feel more comfortable, focused, and supported, especially in environments that may be unfamiliar or challenging. Each cart costs approximately \$350, not including the sensory materials that will fill them. The total estimated cost of the project is about \$5,000.



If donations exceed the amount needed to complete the project, I will also be creating an additional sensory cart for Epiphany Lutheran Church. This cart could be used to support members of our own congregation; children, youth, adults, or visitors who may benefit from sensory tools during worship, fellowship, or church activities.

I am humbly asking the congregation to consider supporting this project through a monetary donation. You can donate now (through my Venmo) or at the Trivia and Dinner event that will be held March 22. There you can speak with me personally to learn more about my project or ask any questions you may have! My goal is to complete the project by early spring.

Any size contribution will help to make this project possible and create a more inclusive space for our church family and the wider community.

Thank you for your prayers, encouragement, and support. I am incredibly grateful to be part of a church that values service, inclusion, and compassion for others.

**Eagle Scout** is the highest rank attainable in the Scouts BSA program of Scouting America. Since its inception in 1911, only four percent of Scouts have earned this rank after a lengthy review process. The Eagle Scout rank has been earned by over 2.75 million youth.

Requirements include earning at least 21 merit badges, 14 of which are mandatory for the award. The Eagle Scout must demonstrate Scout Spirit, an ideal attitude based upon the Scout Oath and Law, service, and leadership. This includes an extensive service project that the Scout plans, organizes, leads, and manages. Eagle Scouts are presented with a medal and a badge that visibly recognizes the accomplishments of the Scout. Additional recognition can be earned through Eagle Palms, awarded for completing additional tenure, leadership, and merit badge requirements.

## HOLY COMMUNION INSTRUCTION FOR 4TH GRADERS


All 4th graders and their parents or caregivers are invited to a special three-week class on Holy Communion.

On Sunday, February 22 Tom Powell, director of Caroline Furnace, and others will be on-site at Epiphany to share more about its ministry. Join us to learn more!








## MOMS' BIBLE STUDY

## **YOUTH MINISTRY**

Epiphany Youth Group, or EYG, is ministry for, with, and by 7<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grade youth and our adult leaders, called Timothy Ministers, and gathers about every other week. Lil Youth is our youth group for 4<sup>th</sup> through 6<sup>th</sup> grade youth, which meets once a month. These "Gatherings" are the heart of our ministry as we grow closer to God, one another, and as we serve the world God loves. Unless otherwise specified, our gatherings will be in Star Lodge from noon to 2:00 pm and include lunch. Parents are always welcome but not required to attend.



CARITAS creates a safe space to heal and time to rebuild for Women who are experiencing homelessness and/or addiction. Epiphany Lutheran Church has a long tradition of supporting Caritas. Long before Caritas had a dedicated building, our church provided a safe place for homeless to live and eat for at least two weeks each year.



When Caritas finally opened a building for their targeted population, we turned our mission to preparing meals for 75-100 women at least three times a year. This past year we provided 3 dinners for 70 clients. Each time we had at least 5 to 7 church members help cook the meals in the church kitchen and transport the food to Caritas the next day. In November we used our leftover money and were able to donate 25 pairs of gloves off the Caritas wishlist. We have also volunteered at Christmas celebration events and donated many items such as gloves, sheets, blankets and coats.
