Words from Our Pastor

Every Sunday during worship I sit right across the giant ranks of pipes above the choir. They are loud and they are shiny, and I like hearing Kevin make them sing. But I've learned that most of the work done by the organ is actually in the wall behind the pipes. In a small room accessible through a door in our main hallway stands a ladder that leads up to a vast system of bellows, wind chambers, and fans that actually make the organ function. The pipes are showy and visible on the outside, but the air flowing behind it is the key to its sound.

This is a lot like how the congregation works, too. There are "up front" things that get our immediate attention when we become involved in a congregation—things like worship, youth programs, service projects and Bible studies—but behind all of it are the indispensable supportive structures that help make the church our ministry home.



As it happens, Epiphany has undertaken enormous improvements and repairs on some of our building's big-ticket supportive structures in the past two years. So much of it goes on behind-the-scenes, and unless you've served on Council you might not be aware of just how extensive these efforts have been. Here's a summary of the main items:

In 2023 we replaced our boiler for about \$80,000. Capital Boiler Works gave us a brand new, more efficient boiler that heats the sanctuary and the Faith Formation Wing.

In 2025 we began maintenance work on our pipe organ. You may have read about that project in Kevin's article in a recent newsletter. This project encompassed a long-overdue cleaning and the addition of new sound features that increase the versatility of the instrument. That work is slated to be completed in late fall of this year, but I can already hear the difference in the organ! All told, that work cost the church approximately \$50,000.

In 2025 we also contracted with Willet Stained Glass to repair some warping and regular wear and tear to our stained glass windows. Some of that work has been focused on the large Jesus window in the narthex, the one that is illuminated at night for people to see as they drive by. This work will total around \$79,000 and was completed on September 28! Without attention to this wear and tear we risked losing that beautiful window.

And if you worshiped with us this summer, you are aware that our 27-year-old sanctuary air conditioner finally "gave up the ghost." After receiving various bids, Council has opted for a new system built by James River Air. This project came in at just under \$90,000 and will be completed by the end of this year...plenty of time to get ready for summer 2026.

Cumulatively that is some really heavy lifting for the congregation in the finances department. Thanks to the generosity of specific individual donors over the past year, and thanks to the Epiphany Endowment Fund and our own budget reserves, which are funded through your offerings, we have been able to meet these needs without directly approaching the congregation. While we are still reeling from all of the repairs happening at once, we are grateful for the way that God has provided through you and through those who've gone before us in this time of need.

Pipe organ, HVAC, stained glass windows...rarely do any of these, by themselves, become the impetus for a person to be involved in a congregation. And yet, without features like these, much of our "up front" ministry

would be difficult to undertake. Things would be too cold, too hot, not as beautiful, and too quiet!

Thank you for the ways in which you support the "behind-the-scenes" ministries and aspects of our congregation's common life. And thanks to God for the gift of this building—and all of its rooms—where so much of Christ's ministry can occur. And a special thanks to the "behind-the-scenes" people too, who've arranged and advised the repairs and maintenance: Rob Hamlin, Steve Collins, Will Klick, and Kevin Barger.


New(er) Members' Classes Sundays, October 5, 12, 19 Bonhoeffer Room, 1st floor, 9:50-10:45 am

Registration is OPEN for our YouthWorks Summer Service Trip to Harrisburg, PA, Sunday, June 21 – Friday, June 26, and all current eighth through twelfth grade students are eligible!

ABOUT HARRISBURG: From one capitol to another, Harrisburg is about 3 and a half hours from Richmond and the capitol of Pennsylvania. We will have the opportunity to serve with a local children's program, community garden, food bank, and assist neighborhood associations with small home repair, community beautification and cleanup projects in order to share God's love. In the evenings let's plan to visit Hershey's Chocolate World for a chocolate tour and explore and enjoy the beauty of Harrisburg.



Registration is now open!

All students who are currently in eighth through twelfth grades are invited to REGISTER by sending a check for \$100 to be made to Epiphany Lutheran Church. You can mail it to 1400 Horsepen Road, Richmond, VA 23226 or put it in my hand when we see one another. The check should have "Harrisburg" and your name in the memo line.

There will also be registration paperwork to complete in the spring but for now your check will secure your place. We currently have set aside 25 spaces for adults and youth for this trip.

Registration will close on Sunday, October 26.

On January 15, or before if you like, participants are asked to complete payment for the trip with an additional \$180. Epiphany will cover the cost of travel (we'll rent vans) and extra activities and most meals are provided by YouthWorks, however, you may wish to bring a small amount of additional money for ice cream or other treats in the evenings. We will return to Epiphany by 5:00 pm on Friday, June 26.

By registering you agree to try your best to attend 3 Getting Ready sessions in the months prior to the trip (April, May, and June), and participate in a Sunday morning worship service when we return to tell the story of God's work through us to our Epiphany Congregation.

As always, if you would like to join us for this trip but the financial cost is too much, please let me know and we will be very happy to take care of the cost so that you can join us. These requests are completely confidential.

This trip is an exciting opportunity to grow closer to God and to one another, to explore the gifts God has given us to share, to follow Jesus in helping and healing our neighbors, to see a part of God's creation most of us haven't experienced, to meet youth from congregations all over the United States who will also be serving with YouthWorks in Harrisburg for the week, and to experience hospitality as we are welcomed into a new community.

Dear 7th and 8th Grade Families --

Lost and Found is a weekend retreat which will take place Friday, **November 21st through Sunday**, **November 23rd** at Eagle Eyrie Conference Center in Lynchburg. Your friends are welcome to come with us.

Our group will meet up at Target in Short Pump and drive together to Eagle Eyrie, stopping along the way to eat dinner together and then from there we'll head to the retreat. During the weekend, we'll meet other seventh and eighth grade students from Lutheran congregations from around Virginia – last year there were 52 youth and 31 adult leaders for a total of 83 participants.

Property Ministry

October 2025

September turned out to be every bit of the jam-packed month we thought it would be. So much to relate, I'll try to fit it in one article!

Let me begin by thanking everyone who helped make Rally Day a success. So much effort by so many, too many to name individually. We had the lawn mowed, tents erected, tables set out, only to have mother nature chase us inside with the rain. It was a great day in spite of that with a good turnout.













The most exciting thing to comment on is our stained glass. Repairs were scheduled to begin on Monday the 22^{nd} but instead began on Thursday the 18^{th} . Kit Sherwood and crew from Willet Stained Glass Studios put in long hours on our project.

Of our 42 glass panels, 28 were contracted to repair/conserve. During repairs, 2 additional windows were discovered to need attention. New structural support bracing was either installed or re-welded. Every window facing Horsepen Road now has a vented, 1/4" protective acrylic covering system in individual


perimeter frames. Cracked glass pieces were either replaced or stabilized with a special epoxy. Where needed, caulking was replaced and painted inside and out. This is most easily observed on the panels lining the commons' Sanctuary wall.






Property Ministry, cont'd

Our main Jesus panel in the Narthex was installed in 1993, and it too needed attention.




The main Sanctuary panels were dedicated in 1981, and I found an interesting bulletin from that service. Each of the icon inserts has a corresponding Bible verse. I'll share some in future articles.



During the walkthrough a few pieces that had been stabilized still show a visible crack. I'll be contacting Willet to determine the cost of replacement. It's a wonderful feeling to know that the overall issue of our stained glass conservation and repair, begun in 2022, has now been completed.





In other big ticket news, James River has ordered our AC equipment, with a lead time of 5 weeks before arrival. In the meantime, they will be removing the old unit, pouring a new concrete slab, and fabricating the necessary ductwork. Hopefully this project will be completed by November.

Corky McCullough gave our devotion, based on Proverbs and Isiah, that reminds us God is always available to guide us, even when we are not aware of His Presence.



The 2025-2026 WELCA Yearbooks were distributed and discussed. Thank you, Eileen, for compiling the Yearbook!






PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY MEETING


