Dear Epiphany Friends –

It's wonderful to be back in the saddle after a summer away! I have really enjoyed hearing about your summer, especially the summer service trip to Western NC, which seemed to be a highlight and milestone in people's faith and lives of service. I thought the youth did a phenomenal job "telling the story" during the sermon time at the worship service following their return. I look forward to the fall and continuing to share stories and experiences.

You may remember that over the summer I reflected on the question "what is the new song God is singing in me?" and I asked you to reflect on this question for yourself and for our congregation as well. theological reflection together on the sabbath, a time of singing, and I will share some songs I wrote this summer. My hope is that this time will offer us a chance to reflect and share what we sense God is up to in our midst. This class will meet at 10:00 am in the Star Lodge, and all are welcome.

On Sunday, September 28 Epiphany will also host a musical event called "First Light: News Songs of Praise" at 4:00 pm. The concert will feature the One Voice Chorus – an interracial community chorus in Richmond that performs choral music for the central Virginia community and has blessed us with their gifts in worship (and also rehearses at Epiphany) – our Epiphany choir and ensembles, and my band, the Sunslingers. I hope you will come and listen to this music but even more importantly, I hope you will take part in the congregational singing and the reception to follow. This event will last about an hour and is open to everyone. I am grateful to the Lilly Clergy Renewal Grant which is sponsoring and funding this event. In a sense, this is the final piece of our sabbatical experience and a chance to sing the New Song of Faith that God has given us.

Again, I want to say thank you for the generous gift of my renewal leave. Currently, I feel very refreshed and glad to be back and I do hope this Sunday school series and concert will be a blessing for our congregation and community. I'll always be grateful for the time of travel with my family and have already experienced that benefit to our ministry here at Epiphany.



Finance Ministry



YTD August, we had receipts of \$590,675 which were 101% of our budgeted receipts of \$579,259 and \$36,982 or 7% higher than 2024.

Expenses were \$640,575 and \$1,024 unfavorable to plan due to the following:

- Christian Ed expense (unfavorable \$2,576) due to earlier than planned spending in Youth and VBS due to sabbatical. Should be on plan for the year.
- Building & Equipment expense (unfavorable \$2,142) as several projects were completed earlier in the year.
- Admin expense (unfavorable \$4,120) due to catch up on tech support billing as we moved from using our church credit card to check payment due to increase in credit card processing fees.
- Several expense categories were favorable partially offsetting the items above.




Organ restoration and repair update

Why do we even bother cleaning the organ and what does that really mean? This may be a question that you have had over the past months/years as we have been exploring work on our instrument at Epiphany. We spent a lot of money on the building and installation of our pipe organ. We clean and maintain it as we treat it as an investment. We want to protect our investment and avoid costly repairs or replacements down the road. Our organ was built by a company called Schantz and was installed in 1986.



As we care for our investment, we should have regular maintenance that keeps the instrument clear of dust and debris. Not doing this might lead us to damage down the road. This is different than tuning the organ, which we also do about twice a year.






Over the past couple of years, we recognized that we had not been taking care of our investment as best we could. We entered in an agreement for cleaning and restoration services. We had all the pipes cleaned and serviced early this year – that provides us with cleaner, sharper and even more bright tones from our instrument. Most recently, you may have noticed that we did not have use of the organ for a couple Sundays. During this time, they took apart the console (the part of the organ with the keys where I sit) and cleaned, replaced some tubing that had dry rotted (it was the original), added all new knobs on the console and a fresh finish. (Come up after worship, and I will show you!). We updated now so that we have memory

levels, making the instrument more usable in various ways for worship services. We had some reconfiguration done with regard to voicing.

There is one final step left in the project, which is the installation of the celeste (a new sound) which will happen as soon as the windchest, which is being custom made, is complete and arrives. This final step should be completed before Christmas. Once complete, the organ will be completely updated and remain a powerful instrument for use in our worship. It makes it more modernized and accessible for use in other settings including concert organists, choirs or other events that we might wish to explore.


This has been an exciting project and represents the first time since installation that we have done this kind of work, so we are "all caught up" for now with a plan for regularly scheduled cleaning maintenance as we move forward. Thank you to Council for their recognition and funding of this important work.

Blessed and Stressed Begins September 14 10:00 am Parlor



First of all, kudos to all who came to donate at our last drive. Although we didn't meet Red Cross' goal for the drive we still managed to collect 21 units which means improving and potentially saving the lives of up to 63 individuals. Many thanks to all of our donors and a happy welcome to those who gave at Epiphany for the first time.



As I'm sure you know there continues to be a great need for blood. Did you know...

- A person in a major car accident can require up to 50 units of red blood cells
- 3% of trauma patients require 10 or more units of blood in 24hrs
- In surgery 8 out of 10 trauma patients who died bled too much

This is not to mention the need for ongoing transfusions for those with blood (including clotting) disorders, cancers requiring chemotherapy, and burns.

FYI, our next blood drive will take place **October 12** in Price Hall. We hope to continue to expand our list of donors, at Epiphany and outside of the congregation so please help by spreading the word to neighbors and coworkers about Epiphany's drive.




What happens when you sneeze without anyone near you? Nothing. What happens if the problem is more than a sneeze that no one can readily see or hear?


