### Big Idea: The Spirit speaks when God's people seek!

- I. Seek the Lord in community. [1]
  - 1. How can godly community help us discern God's will more clearly than we could alone?
  - 2. Have you ever received direction or confirmation through the counsel or prayers of others? What did that experience teach you about listening together?
- II. Seek the Lord through worship. [2a]
  - 1. What does it mean to "minister to the Lord"? How is that different from simply attending worship?
  - 2. Why do you think worship, not work or worry, was the setting in which the Spirit spoke?
  - 3. What might change in your worship if you sought God's *heart* more than His *help*?
- **III.** Seek the Lord in surrender. [2b-3]
  - 1. How does surrender open you to His direction?
  - 2. Why is surrender often the hardest part of seeking God's plan?
  - 3. How can you tell when your seeking has turned into surrender?
- IV. Seek the Lord ready to follow through. [4-5]
  - 1. What does obedience reveal about our trust in God's guidance?
  - 2. Why do you think God often gives direction one step at a time rather than the whole plan?
  - 3. How can delayed obedience or partial obedience hinder what the Spirit wants to do in your life?

- 1. What is one way you will intentionally *seek* the Lord this week in community, in worship, in surrender, or in obedience?
- 2. Share any area where you need clarity or courage to obey, and pray specifically for one another to hear and respond to the Spirit's call.
