A Case for Removing Congregational from our Church Name

At our last Annual Meeting, there was quite a bit of discussion on the idea of dropping the word *Congregational* from our church name and adopting *Community Church of Sun City*. We did not formally take a vote on this matter at that meeting, and there were many feelings expressed, and a variety of alternative name change suggestions offered.

The bottom line is that all Protestant denominations are losing members and attendees at worship. Experts believe that including a denominational name like Methodist, Congregational, and Presbyterian can be offputting for people today seeking a Biblically-based, self-governing church community.

In Sun City alone, a number of local churches have already removed a denominational label from their identity such as Grace Bible, Bellevue Heights, Radiant Church, Palm West, and many others. If someone moves to Sun City, and they want a church where they will hear clear, Biblically based sermons, the name Congregational puts them off even visiting our church because they are unclear what Congregational means. They then go to other churches in the area without a denominational name, and we lose out.

If you Google the top fastest, growing churches in the country, only one of the top 15 identifies with a denominational label. The rest have names which suggest a local community church, a church where the members control their own destiny and are not dictated to by a hierarchical structure.

Ironically, we have always been an autonomous, self-governing church with members making the decisions and controlling the church destiny, but visitors do not realize this unless they endeavor to learn more and ask questions about the church once they come visit. The name of our church should reflect what we are at the heart, in laymen's terms, a self-governing, non-denominational church so as not to instinctively discourage a visitor from even coming through the door.

Subject to the approval of the Church Council meeting on October 30, we will hold a Special Meeting for church members on Wednesday, November 19 to make a decision for changing our name to Community Church of Sun City. A letter will be sent to all members at least 2 weeks before the meeting, and opportunity for voting remotely will be offered to those unable to attend in person.

We will *still* be a Congregational church affiliated with the National Association of Congregational Christian Churches. Our legal name will *still* be The Congregational Church of Sun City. But we will adopt a DBA (Doing Business As) of *Community* Church of Sun City, if approved. In addition to the use of *Community* being widely known as self-governing, using the same initials (CCSC) allows us to keep our web domain, email addresses, and other business items the same shorthand as well. I personally believe the time has come to cut the anchor that is holding us back from attracting prospective new members to visit our church and ultimately call us home with this name change and hope you will prayerfully give this matter some thought before November.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES PERSPECTIVE

Welcome Tandem Home Education!

As many of you are already aware, Tandem Home Education has chosen our church facility as their home for the 2025-26 school year. Tandem Home Education is in-class support for homeschooled students. Classes are held two days per week and provide homeschooled students an opportunity for in class educational experience.

Chelsea and Chris Derkach, the founders of Tandem Home Education, have worked with the CCSC Board of Trustees, as well as office and maintenance staff, to find ways for CCSC's facility to fit their space needs. Tandem will be using all areas of the church except the offices and conference room on Tuesdays and Fridays from August 12 through May 8. They will set up the space for the classes in the morning before school begins, and return the space to the original set up at the end of their school day. On Tuesdays and Fridays, church members and activities will be confined to the office area to minimize any contact of adults from our congregation with the students for safety and liability protection.

We are thrilled to have Tandem at CCSC. It is a God sent opportunity for us to partner with a Christian based organization that is providing such a vital service. Not only will the leasing fees paid by Tandem infuse our budget with much needed revenue, but the church facility will be alive with young people and families. Tandem classes begin August 12. A Teacher Orientation was held last month on July 25.

Tandem has arranged their class schedule to allow a full week in November for the Arts & Crafts Fair, as well as two full weeks in March for the Rummage Sale. They also have offered their students to help with table set up and sale preparation. Tandem is committed to being a partner with CCSC, and we hope this partnership will continue for many years.

A big thank you to all those who helped make this partnership a reality. I encourage congregation members to visit the Tandem web site at www.tandemhomeeducation.org to get a full picture of their operation.

Treasurer's Report

The information presented herein reflects the financial status of the church as of June 30, 2025. After six months of the year, the church is doing well financially. Total contributions are approximately \$18,000 over budgetary expectations for this time period. The budget itemizes expenses for eight categories. The categories are Ministerial, Music Ministry, Maintenance, Administration, Membership, Missions, Deacons, and Music Scholarship. Expenditures in every category are below or at anticipated budget amounts. Overall, expenses are \$11,000 below budget.

To balance the budget, it was expected to be necessary to transfer \$232,036 from our cash, stocks, and mutual funds at Wells Fargo to our Chase checking account. At this time, \$75,000 has been transferred, which is only 32% of the expected budget transfer amount.

Starting in August, Tandem Home Education will be renting our facility during the school year and paying a facility use fee of \$7,000 per month. The students will be on site two days a week. The church will earn a total of \$56,000 this school year.

I want to thank all members of our church family and the members of the Board of Trustees for ensuring the financial stability of our church.




