THE GREAT THANKSGIVING 2: TRADITIONAL ANGLICAN-METHODIST		
The Lord be with you.		
And with thy Spirit.		
Lift up your hearts.		
We lift them up unto the Lord.		
Let us give thanks unto the Lord.		
It is meet and right to do so.		
It is very meet, right, and our bounden duty that we should at all times and in all places give thanks unto thee, O Lord, holy Father, almighty, everlasting God;		
because thou didst give Jesus Christ, thine only Son, to be born as at this time for us;		

who, by the operation of the Holy Ghost, was made very man,
and that without spot of sin, to make us clean from all sin;
therefore with angels and archangels, and with the company of heaven,
we laud and magnify thy glorious name,
evermore praising thee, and singing (saying):

**Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of hosts:
Heaven and earth are full of thy glory!
Glory be to thee, O Lord most high!**

Almighty God, our heavenly Father,
who of thy tender mercy didst give thine only Son Jesus Christ
to suffer death upon the cross for our redemption;
who made there, by the one offering of himself,
a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice for the sins of the whole world;
and did institute, and in his holy Gospel
command us to continue,
a perpetual memory of his precious death
until his coming again:

Hear us, O merciful Father, we most humbly beseech thee,
and grant that we, receiving these thy creatures of bread and wine,
according to thy Son our Savior Jesus Christ's holy institution,
in remembrance of his passion, death, and resurrection,
may be partakers of the divine nature through him:

Who
in the same night that he was betrayed took bread;
and when he had given thanks, he broke it,
and gave it to his disciples saying, take eat;
this is my body which is given for you;
do this in remembrance of me.

Likewise after supper he took the cup;
and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying,
drink ye all of this; for this is my blood of the New Covenant,
which is shed for you and for many, for the forgiveness of sins;
do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me.

O Lord, our heavenly Father, we thy humble servants
desire thy fatherly goodness
mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving;
most humbly beseeching thee to grant, that, by the merits and death
of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood,
we and thy whole church may obtain forgiveness of our sins,
and all other benefits of his passion.

And here we offer and present unto thee, O Lord,
ourselves, our souls and bodies,
to be a reasonable, holy, and living sacrifice unto thee; humbly beseeching thee
that all we who are partakers of this Holy Communion
may be filled with thy grace and heavenly benediction.

And although we be unworthy, through our manifold sins,
to offer unto thee any sacrifice, yet we beseech thee to accept
this our bounden duty and service, not weighing our merits,
but pardoning our offenses; through Jesus Christ our Lord,
by whom and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit,

all honor and glory be unto thee, O Father almighty, world without end.


