

From Our Pastor

"How is it with your soul?"



This was a question early Methodists in 18th-century England would ask one another in small groups. Their gatherings—called "class meetings"—were spaces of encouragement, accountability, and prayer.

That old question feels especially timely today. With so much news of violence and oppression, our souls can feel weighed

down. Freedom, safety, and peace often seem out of reach.

This Sunday marks the **International Day of Peace** (World Peace Day, September 21). Just days later, on October 2, we observe the **International Day of Non-Violence**, Gandhi's birthday. These days remind us how deeply our world needs peace and non-violence.

I want to invite you into a simple practice: **journaling for peace and non-violence.** This isn't about retreating into silence or attempting something grand. It's about beginning where we are—allowing peace to take root in our own souls and flow into our daily actions. Small steps of kindness, patience, and care compound over time to create lasting change.
