From Our Pastor



Mother Teresa once said, "I alone cannot change the world, but I can cast a stone across the waters to create many ripples."

Doing good can be surprisingly complicated. Even after we've done something kind or generous, we might wonder, *Did it really make a difference?* Sometimes, we comfort ourselves by saying, *At least it made me feel good*. But if goodness only serves to make us feel better, is it truly good?

Let's take a step back. None of us exists in isolation. We become who we are through others. A person is a person because of relationships—because of belonging. Families, friends, and communities shape us, hold us, and give meaning to what we do.

The church, at its best, is one such intentional community—a place where we choose to belong because we follow Jesus Christ. Baptism and confirmation are not simply rituals; they are moments of saying, *I belong to this story, this people, this way of life.*

Now imagine this: one small stone can make ripples across the water. What happens when a whole community casts stones of love, compassion, and faith together? The ripples multiply. They become waves—perhaps even a tsunami of goodness.

That is the vision I hold: that a single act of faith might set off a chain reaction of hope—one ripple at a time, until the waters of the world begin to move with grace.

You might say that goodness, when shared, doesn't just echo—it transforms. Let us do all the good you can

Go to <u>app.onlinememberdirectory.com</u> (if you have trouble with the link, please copy and paste it into your browser)

Click the option labeled "First time login from old system."

Once your record is found, review the information and click "Yes, this is me"

Follow the prompts to migrate your account. Then you'll be logged into our church directory.
