From Our Pastor



Kenosis names the way Jesus lived. The word comes from Greek and means "to empty," and it shows how Jesus chose to use power. He did not cling to status or privilege. He did not lead by force. He let go of what could have set him above others and lived with an open hand and an open heart. In that way, he revealed God's life in human form.

As we approach Consecration Sunday, we step into that same spirit of release. It invites us to turn away from the constant message that we never have enough and instead trust the generosity of God. I am reminded of the scene where Jesus feeds five thousand people with five loaves and two fish. Jesus invites the disciples into his way of giving. "You give them something to eat." They bring what little they have. Then a child offers his entire meal. Jesus blesses it, breaks it, and shares it. His act of giving becomes an invitation for the whole crowd.

I can imagine the moment when that child offered everything he carried. Something shifted in the crowd. People begin to open their bags. "I can share this." "I have something to offer." As they release what they were holding onto, the community discovered more than enough for everyone. This is what happens when someone or a whole community chooses the downward path so another can rise. It reflects the way Christ lived and creates space where God's abundance can begin to grow.

If a child's small gift can help bring life to someone else, why would we doubt that our own gifts can do the same?
