

Suggested Questions for Doxa Church G2 Groups
1 Corinthians 15:12-19, “Resurrection Matters,” September 6, 2026, Kevin Stuhlmann

Main Point: *No resurrection, no hope.

1. Read 1 Corinthians 15:12-19. Some at Corinth were denying the resurrection of the dead (v. 12). What are some reasons that people today might doubt the possibility of the dead being raised?
2. Kevin talked about the danger of prioritizing human philosophies and worldviews over Scripture. What are some examples you've seen of this?
3. Some Christians limit their understanding (and hope) of the afterlife to our souls going to heaven to be with God upon our death. Why do you think this is the case?
4. What fuller picture of the afterlife does the Bible give (see Rev. 21)?

5. Verse 13 says that if there's no resurrection of the dead, then Christ hasn't been raised either. What truths about Christ and his relationship with his people makes this statement true? In other words, why can't we (or the Corinthians) just say that Christ was a special case, and he is the only one to be resurrected?
6. If it were true that Christ was not raised, how would this make both gospel preaching and gospel faith "in vain" (vv. 14-15)? Include what he says from the rest of the passage (vv. 16-19).
7. Explain the Main Point: "No resurrection, no hope."
8. Paul continues in verse 20, refuting the false premise: "But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead." How has your own hope been strengthened from this passage?
9. What other comments, questions, or personal applications do you have from this passage?
