

Main Point: *The fact of Christ's resurrection has glorious results.

1. Read 1 Corinthians 15:20-34. From verses 20-23, what different factors are listed that guarantee the future resurrection of believers in Christ?
2. What does it mean to be “in” Adam (v. 22)? “In” Christ? What is one “this-week-in-your-life” application from the fact that you “belong to Christ” (v. 23)?
3. What do verses 24-28 say will happen after Christ’s return?
4. How should Jesus’ future comprehensive victory over all enemies affect the way we think about our own enemies, our suffering, and the evil and injustice in the world?

5. How do verses 24-28 describe the interaction and relationship between the God the Father and God the Son?
6. In verses 29-32, Paul lists three situations which make no sense if naysayers about the resurrection are correct: baptism, suffering for Christ, and a life of self-control. Explain his reasoning for each. How does each situation in fact make sense given that Christ is raised and we will be raised?
7. How should the reality of the resurrection affect our thinking and behavior (vv. 33-34)?
8. What other comments, questions, or personal applications do you have from this passage?
9. Verse 28 says that the end or goal of all this is “that God may be all in all.” The subpoint was “the fact of Christ’s resurrection results in God’s glory.” Spend some time in your G2 praising God for the truths of this passage.
