

CBC Junior Camp 2019



CentriKid is a camp for 3rd–6th graders to experience the time of their lives and learn more about the message of Jesus Christ! From the future sports star to the young scientist to the rising chef, every kid gets to participate in exciting activities of their choice. Kids will take part in Bible study, recreation, track times, and worship. CentriKid is staffed by college and seminary students who can't wait to hang out with your kids and love to share Christ through every aspect of camp! In 2019, the theme is "All Access" God wants Himself to be known. He has given you an "all access pass" by revealing His name, the way to Him through Jesus, and His power as an expression of His love for you. God has revealed that He is the only true God, He's not hidden, and He wants a relationship with you.

How Much? \$315. The 1st \$60 payment is due by February 11. The 2nd \$60 payment is due by April 22. The final balance is due by July 1. All payments are made to CBC.

When we leave: We will leave at 8:30 AM sharp on July 29 from the back parking lot of the church. Plan to arrive by 8:00 AM so you can check in your camper's lunch money and medications. We will stop for lunch, **not** breakfast. It is about a 4.5 hour drive without traffic. We plan to arrive around 2 PM.

When we return: We will leave Middletown, MD on August 2 at 10:15 AM. Traffic permitting, we plan to arrive back at the church around 4 PM. We will call parents when we are an hour away to give a more exact ETA.

What to bring: ~Sleeping bag or bedding (single beds – linens & blanket), ~Pillow, ~Shampoo, toothpaste, toothbrush, deodorant, etc ~Clothes that can be worn to recreation and tracks (t-shirts/shorts for each day) ~Clothes that can get messy (for games) ~Bag for dirty clothes ~Tennis shoes for rec/outdoor tracks ~Bible, notepad, pen, and backpack to carry things ~Water bottle ~Sunscreen ~Spending money for snacks, and camp store (\$30 recommended, but all optional, of course) ~Modest one-piece bathing suit or two-piece with dark shirt to wear over it ~A watch ~Towels - for the pool and for showers. (Don't forget to label everything!)

Campers CAN bring CD or MP3 players, video games, playing cards, or cellular phones. We ask that the content they will be viewing/listening to/etc. is God honoring. All of these items will be confiscated before entering camp and returned to the campers when we leave for home. We also suggest your child brings a disposable camera. Bringing a disposable camera is optional, but it is a great way to take pictures since they will not have their electronics during the week.

What NOT to bring: ~Anything that advertises alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs ~Anything that promotes racism, sexism, or hatred of any group or person ~Anything that promotes sexual actions or situations ~Short or tight-fitting clothing ~Alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs, fireworks, or any kind of weapon ~Rollerblades, skateboards, or water guns

Parent Packet (attached): This will have all that you need to know. It has information such as the camp schedule, FAQ, what to bring, the spiritual truths we will be discussing at camp, what color team their camper will be, etc. Please pack a shirt of the camper's team color for games or you can send money to purchase the correct t-shirt at the Camp Store. The last sheet is the registration form.

Track Time: Campers will have a "track time" every day. On the morning of our departure on July 29, you will fill out track time cards for your child. Check out the track time sheet attached to start thinking about what track they want to do!

Medications: All medications that need to travel to camp with the camper must be placed in a plastic zip lock bag with camper's name, list of meds, and frequency of administering. The meds will be signed out at the time of departure and signed back in at the time of arrival. They will be administered by a MAT trained certified leader.

Money: Your camper will need to take lunch money for the trip down and for the return trip. This money will be placed in an envelope with your camper's name and marked "Lunch." There is a camp store with lots of goodies for your camper to purchase. Campers are responsible for holding their own money for purchasing items at the camp store.

Dress: CentriKid asks that folks at camp are "clean, neat, and modest" but they don't have a restrictive list. Campers must have athletic shoes for track time and recreation. For more info, see the "what to bring/what not to bring" list.

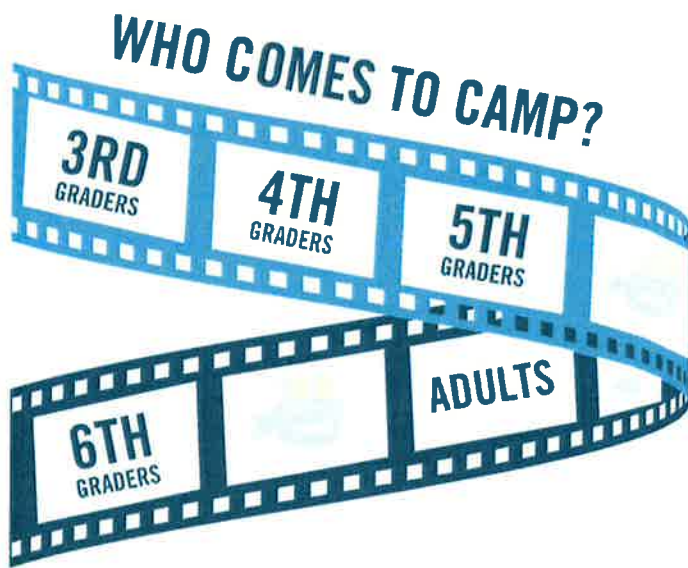


FOCUS ON RELATIONSHIPS!

PACKING LIST

WHAT TO BRING:

*It's helpful for kids to write their names on their clothing tags and accessories, in case items are misplaced.

ESSENTIAL

- Sleeping bag or bedding (Ask your Group Leader about sheet size)
- Shampoo, toothpaste, toothbrush, deodorant, etc
- Clothes that can be worn to recreation and tracks (t-shirts/shorts for each day)
- Clothes that can get messy (for OMC)
- Modest one-piece bathing suit or two-piece with dark shirt to wear over it
- Bag for dirty clothes
- Towels – for the pool and for showers.
- Tennis shoes for rec/outdoor tracks
- Bible, notepad, pen, and backpack to carry things
- Water bottle
- Don't forget to label everything!

- Spending money for snacks, camp store, and missions offering
- An alarm clock
- A watch

WHAT NOT TO BRING:

- Anything that advertises alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs
- Anything that promotes racism, sexism, or hatred of any group or person
- Anything that promotes sexual actions or situations
- Short or tight fitting clothing
- Alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs, fireworks, or any kind of weapon
- iPods, Tablets, Laptops, skateboards, game consoles, or other items at the discretion of your church group lead

TRACK DESCRIPTIONS

ADVENTURE - Participate in fun outdoor activities unique to Skycroft (Outdoor)

ARCHERY - Learn how to shoot a bow & arrow and even practice on our foam targets (Outdoor)

ART STUDIO - A combination of painting, sculpting & crafting (Indoor)

BASEBALL - In this Track kids will be learning fundamentals and having fun improving their baseball skills (Outdoor)

BASKETBALL - In this Track kids will be learning fundamentals and having fun improving their basketball skills (Outdoor)

BLAST - Participate in fun water activities unique to Skycroft (Outdoor)

BUILD IT - Creative hands-on building activities (Indoor)

CHEERNASTICS - A combination of cheerleading & gymnastics (Indoor)

CREATIVE DANCE - Learn a creative movement, This track will no longer be performed on stage (Indoor)

DRAMA - Learn what it means to be an actor and perform various skits (Indoor)

FLAG FOOTBALL - Learn various skills, drills & games of football (Outdoor)

NO BOYS ALLOWED - A girls-only indoor track with discussion and activities (Indoor)

OFF THE WALL - You better be ready to jump, duck, and throw. Whether it's making trick shots or running an obstacle course...this track is off the wall! (Outdoor)

OUTDOOR GAMES - Play some favorites like wiffle ball, capture the flag & ultimate Frisbee (Outdoor)

SIGN LANGUAGE - Learn the basics and perform a song through sign language in front of camp (Indoor)

SOCCER - Learn various skills, drills & games of soccer (Outdoor)

SPLISH SPLASH - Fun and crazy games in the pool (Outdoor)

TELL THE WORLD - Kids will learn about missions around the world and how to share their faith with others (Indoor)

VOLLEYBALL - In this Track kids will learn the basic skills, drills and games of Volleyball (Outdoor)

WEIRD SCIENCE - Fun experimental games & activities with safe ingredients (Indoor)

WET & WILD - Soak up some fun with sponges, water hoses, and of course the CentriKid slip and slide (Outdoor)

CAMP LINGO

ADULT LEADER

Any adult in your church group. The "Group Leader" is the one main adult who is responsible for leading and organizing your church/group.

TIME ALONE WITH GOD

Campers will use the devotional time found inside their name tag.

TEAM TIME

Includes Recreation and Bible Study with a camper's individual team of kids, all led by our staff

ADULT GATHERING

The time for Adult Leaders to be encouraged and connect with the Lord after some important announcements is Adult Gathering. This happens during Team Time and will be different each day.

THE SPOT

The Spot is a central area of campus and will be set up with several CentriKid flags where campers will meet to rotate to different activities.

PARTY

Party will rotate with afternoon Bible Study. Half of the camp will be in the auditorium for high-energy games! Your church group will sit together during the Party. If you're an Adult Leader, be sure you're in Party!

HANG TIME

Hang Time is time for staff and Adult Leaders to hang out with campers as they do activities, visit the Camp Store, etc. There will be multiple options each day.

WORSHIP

For Worship, the whole camp meets together in the auditorium. You will be given a specific section to sit in during Worship. Bring your Bible and a writing utensil.

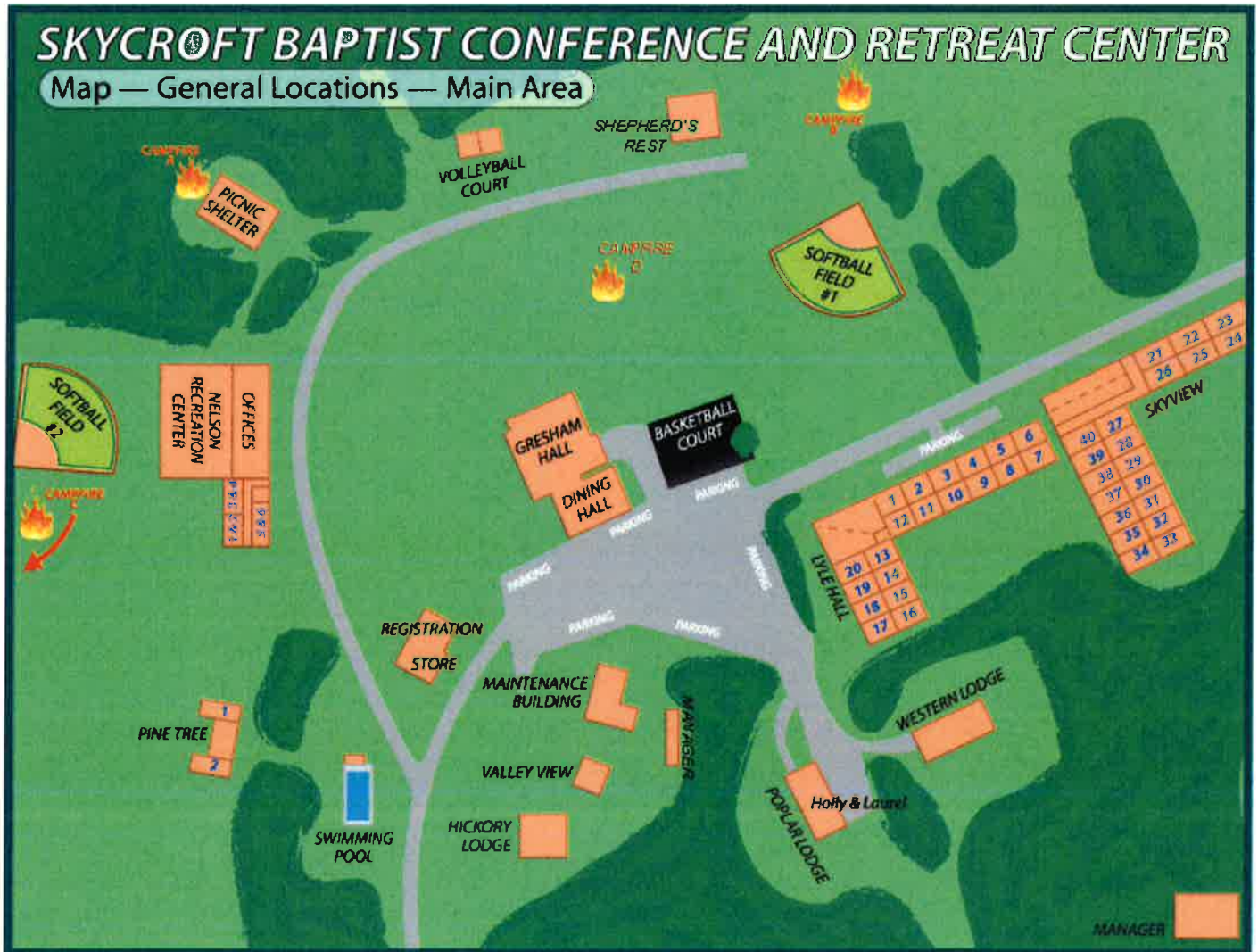
RESPONSE TIME

An opportunity in Worship for kids to respond to what God is teaching them is Response Time. Staffers will greet your kids, and we encourage an Adult Leader from your church to join the conversation.

CHURCH GROUP TIME

Church Group Time is your group getting together and talking about the day! Your church group host, a CentriKid staffer, will take you to your assigned room.

CAMPUS MAP



As soon as you enter campus, you will see CentriKid flags and staff in matching CentriKid shirts pointing you to where you will need to go for Check-In.

HOUSING

ARRANGEMENTS

Girls are primarily housed in Skycroft's motel-style accommodations. Each motel room has two sets of unique bunk beds, the bottom bunk being a double bed with a twin bed on the top. Boys are housed in bunk-bed style lodges with twin-size beds. *Girls will need to bring double sheets, twin sheets or sleeping bags; boys will need to bring twin sheets or a sleeping bag.* Lodging can be viewed online at the Skycroft website.

THINGS TO BRING

Towels and linens are NOT provided. Skycroft suggests each camper brings a sleeping bag, a shower towel and a towel for water activities.

Housing will be determined when we have received participant lists for the churches attending camp for the week. Be sure your Participant List is complete 3 weeks before camp. We are doing this through Google Docs this year, and you will receive your specific link from CentriKid.

A. Permission For Medical Treatment: Hereby grant my permission for any church staffer or counselor, or adult present or in charge of First Aid, to obtain necessary medical attention in case of sickness or injury to Participant, including transporting Participant to a medical facility and sharing the above information with medical personnel, and further hereby give permission for medical personnel to administer medical care to Participant, as necessary.

B. Acknowledgement and Permission: Hereby acknowledge that any activity involves the potential for contact with someone other than camp staffers (i.e. employees at a non-LifeWay sponsored event, church volunteers, etc.). I further acknowledge that if Participant is attending a camp with:

1. Construction Activities, that those may include but are not limited to 1) painting, installing doors, installing windows, building porches, constructing wheelchair ramps, conducting cleanup activities, scraping paint and removing debris from the work site, climbing ladders, nailing nails, scraping paint, carrying heavy building supplies and serving each day in sometimes extreme summer temperatures, 2) travel to and from each worksite, and 3) PARTICIPANTS AGE 16 AND OLDER MAY ENGAGE IN ACTIVITIES INCLUDING OPERATING POWER TOOLS AND WORKING ON SLOPED ROOFS.

2. Recreation Event Activities that those may include but are not limited to 1) initiative games, high and low challenge courses, outdoor education, paintball, aquatics (including beach activities where applicable), 2) climbing or descending unpredictable and possibly slick or uneven terrain, 3) activities leading to elevated heart and respiratory rates, 4) traveling long distances in remote settings, 5) carrying weight on your back and shoulders, 6) encountering unforeseen forces of nature and weather, 7) experiencing uncomfortable group dynamics.

3. Mission Event Activities that those may include but are not limited to 1) travel hazards, 2) being a distance from medical care, 3) experiencing uncomfortable group dynamics.

4. International Mission Event Activities that those may include but are not limited to 1) travel hazards, 2) being a distance from medical care 3) political instability in mission location, 4) traveling long distances in remote settings, and 5) experiencing uncomfortable group dynamics.

C. Photograph/Video Acknowledgement and Permission: Acknowledge that there may be photographs taken or videotaping during normal event activities, and I hereby grant my permission for such photographs/videos to be taken and to be used in promotional materials.

D. Release and Indemnity: Acknowledge and agree that I release and forever hold harmless LifeWay Christian Resources of the Southern Baptist Convention ("LifeWay"), the venue, church, project and event sponsors and state conventions as well as their members, trustees, directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors and affiliates (collectively, the "Released Parties") from any and all claims or demands for personal injury, sickness, and death, as well as property damage and expenses, of any nature whatsoever, incurred by me or my minor child while participating in or employed by this project or the events and/or while on property leased or owned by the Release Parties.
