Seventy-two Christmases have come and gone for us and this one has been the busiest ever! We spent Christmas Eve in Tijuana, Mexico after performing the 25th wedding anniversary renewing-of-vows ceremony for Cruz and Betty on the 23rd. It was a blessing to see how God has blessed this congregation. The members bought everything, from the rings, dress, shoes, food, cakes, and flowers to a surprise "honeymoon" trip to Cabo San Lucas with all expenses paid. Cruz left Juarez 11 years ago as a missionary to Tijuana after starting two churches. The church he started was organized a couple years ago and is presently searching for a pastor so Cruz and Betty can start another church. Cruz's nephew, Jonathon, recently started a mission in nearby Ensenada and is running around 30. On Christmas day we headed for Fallbrook, CA to spend a very merry, memorable, and delicious Christmas with some good friends. As Andy was giving Bob a tour of the property, Bob took a step up a hill, fell back, rolled a few feet scraping his head on some rocks and landed up against a tree (as he remembers it!). The scrapes on his head are healed and upon arriving home, the chiropractor adjusted his hips and shoulder and now he is fine!

The Mt. Zion Baptist Mission founded by Jose Angel Reyes and co-pastored by his son Noel Reyes is growing.
